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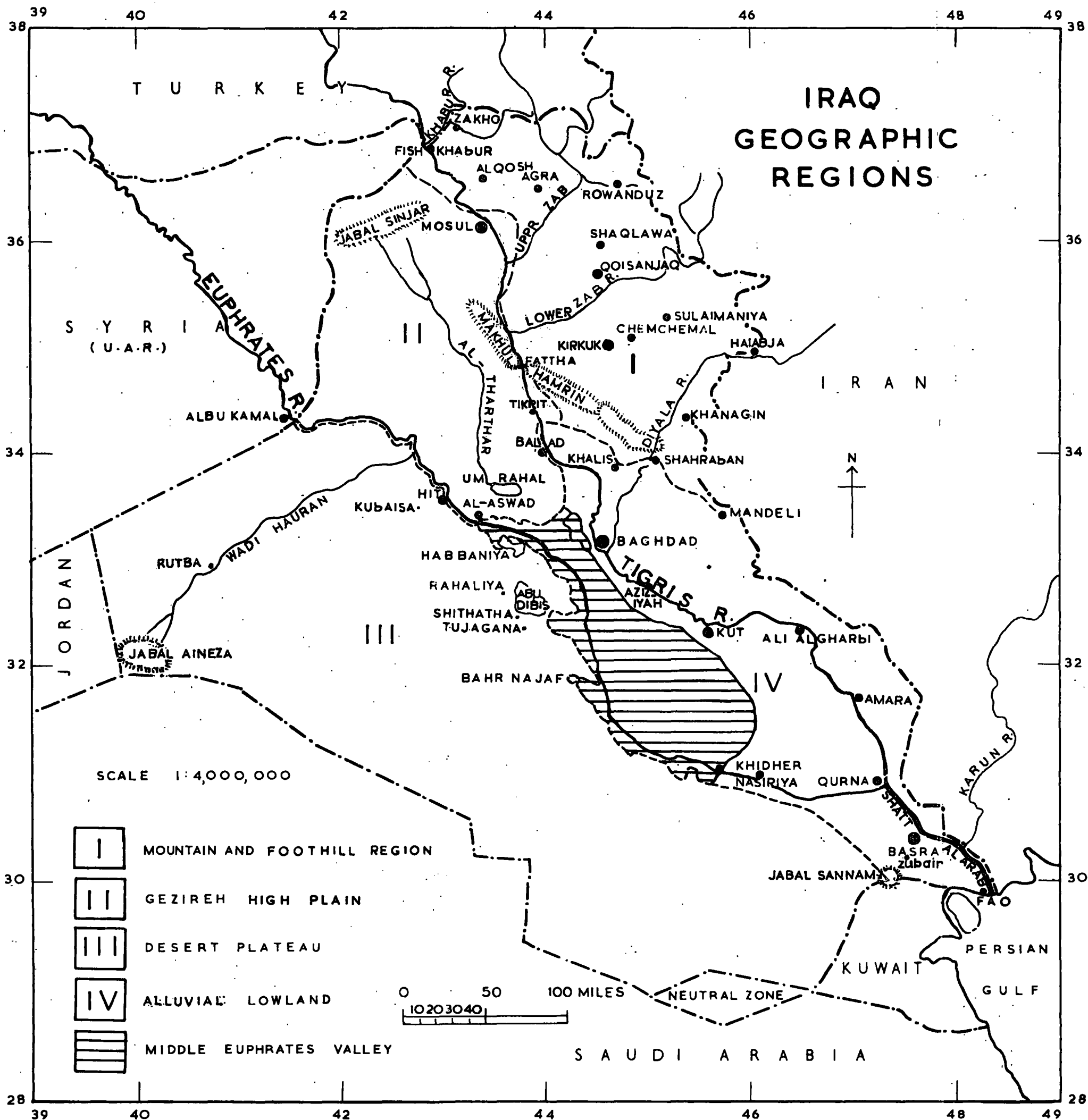

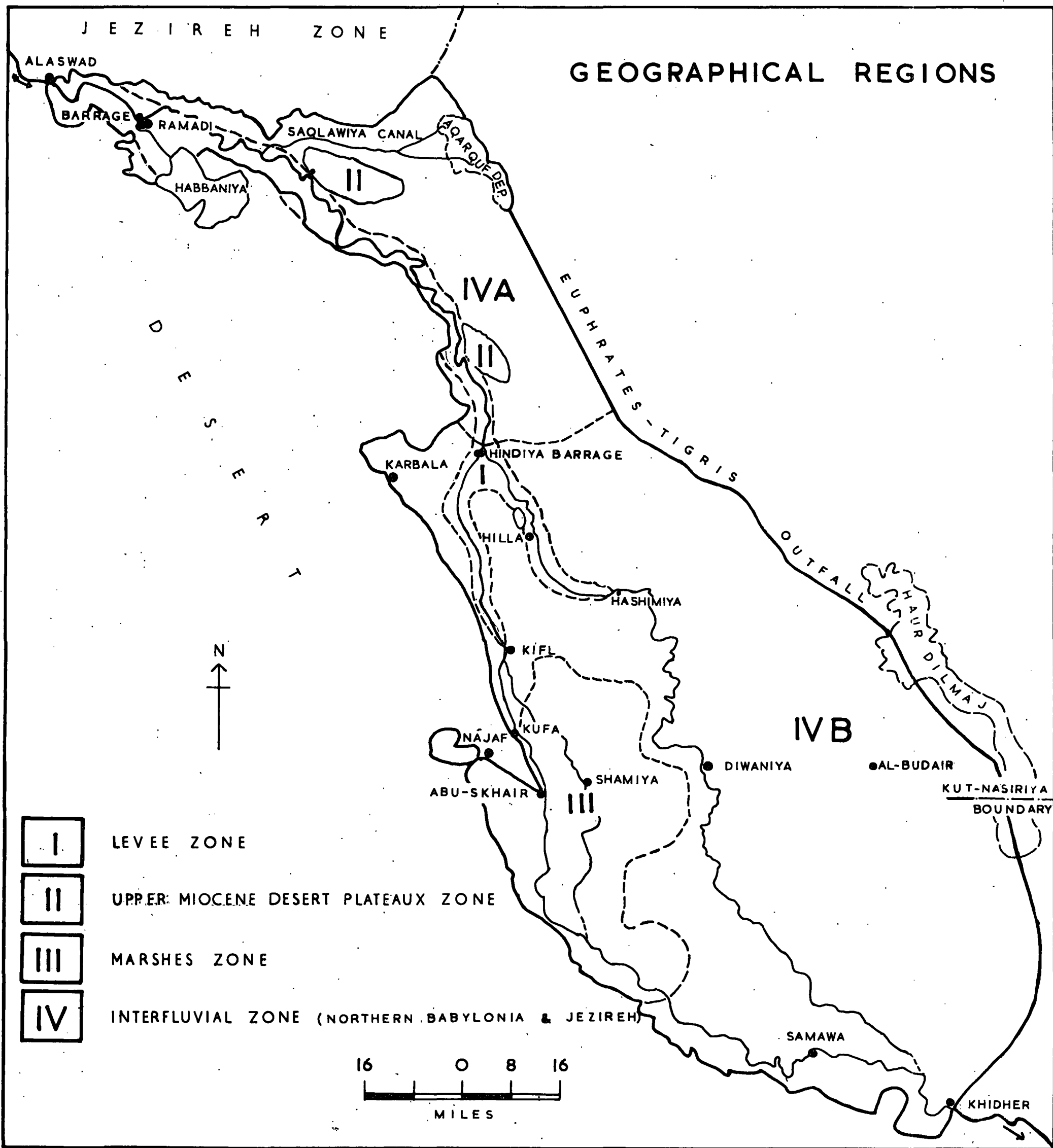

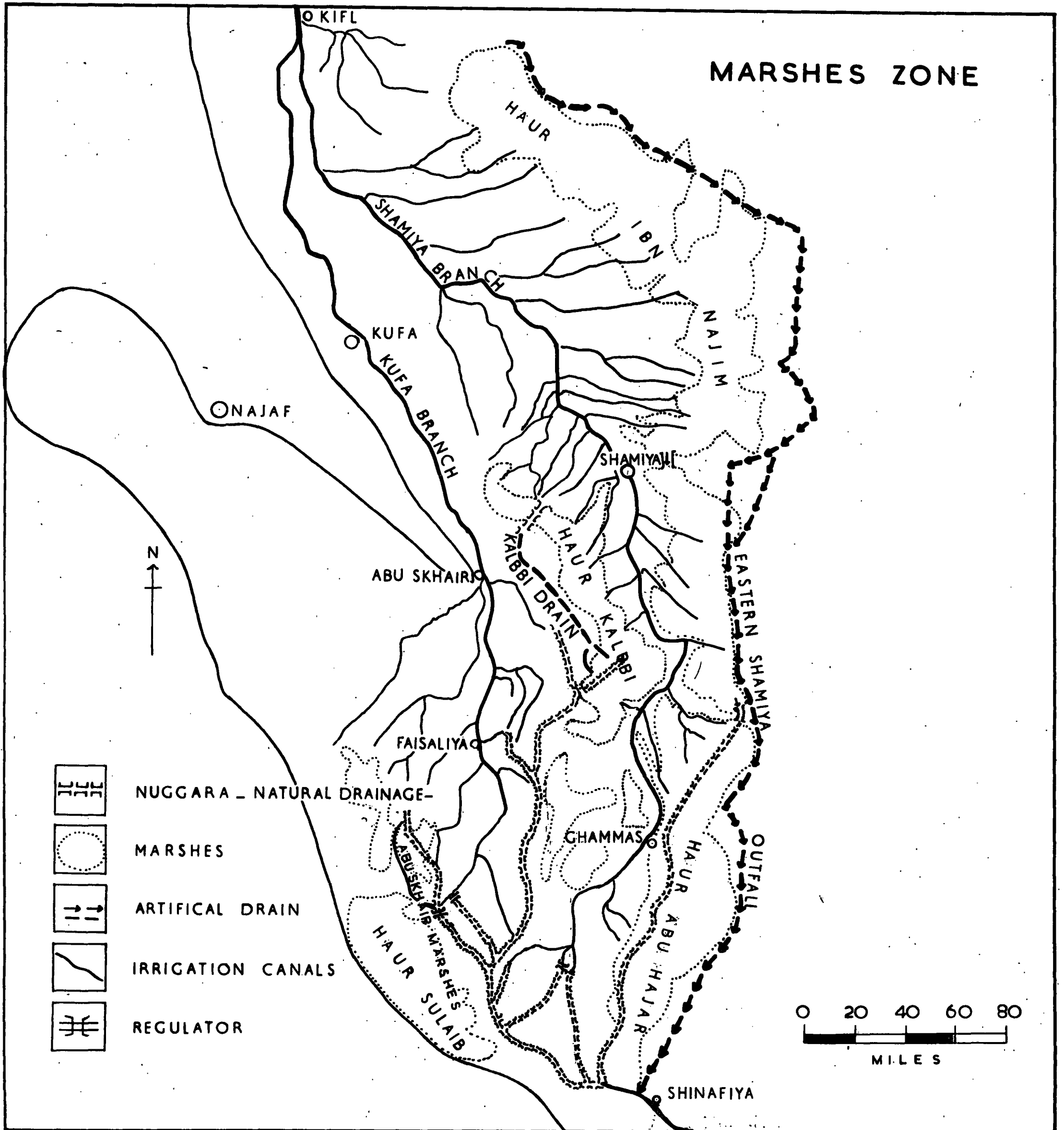
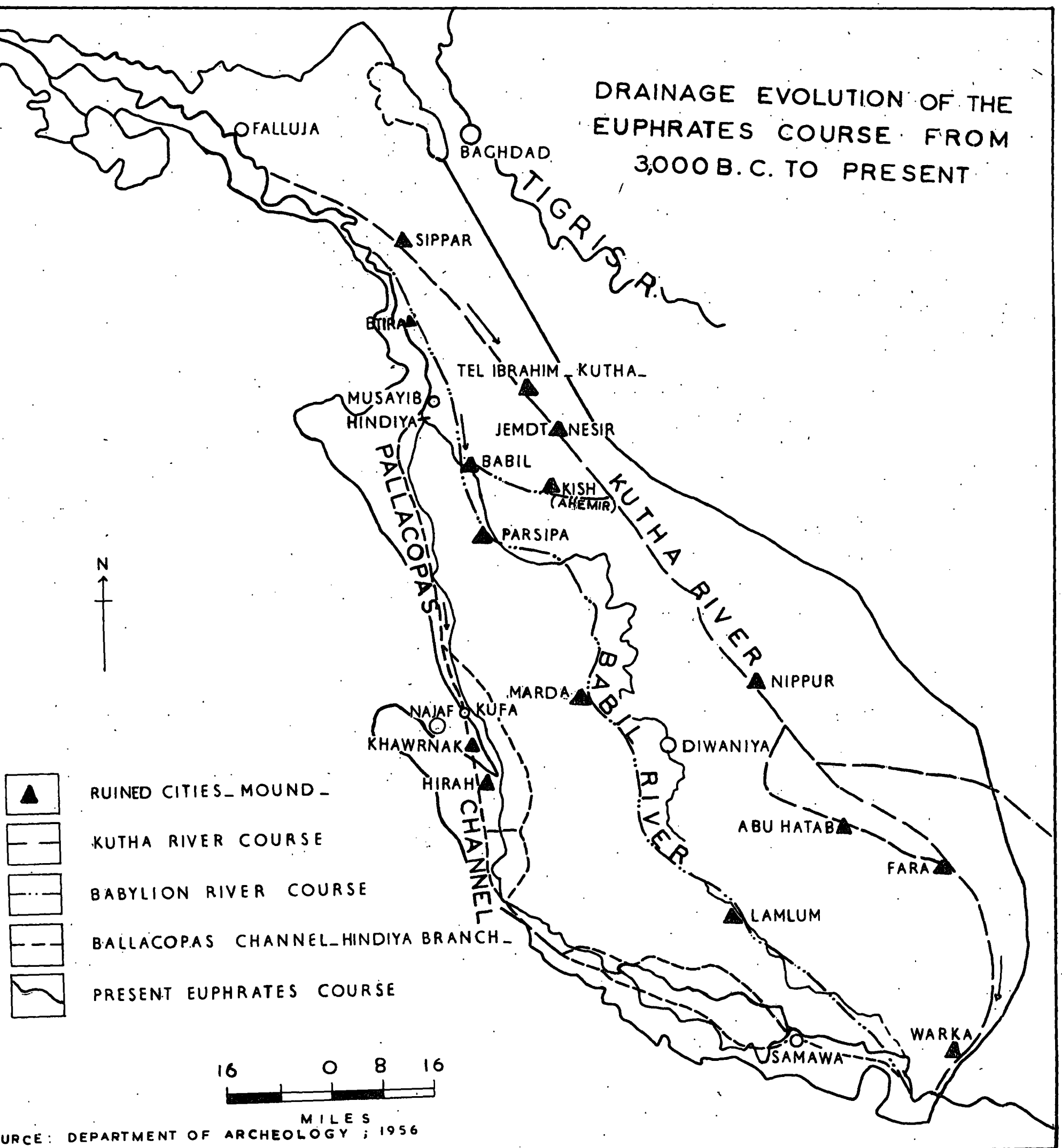

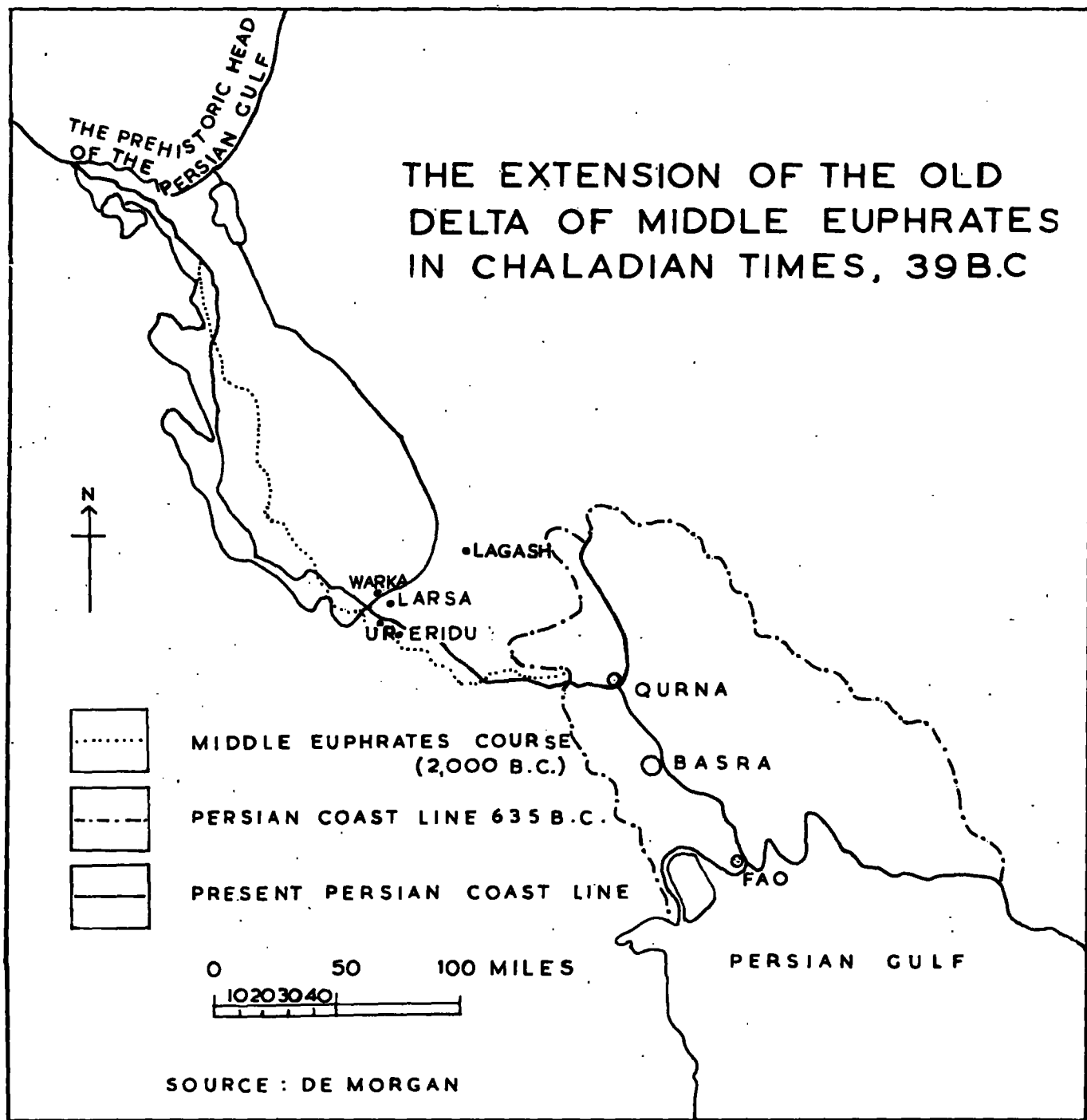

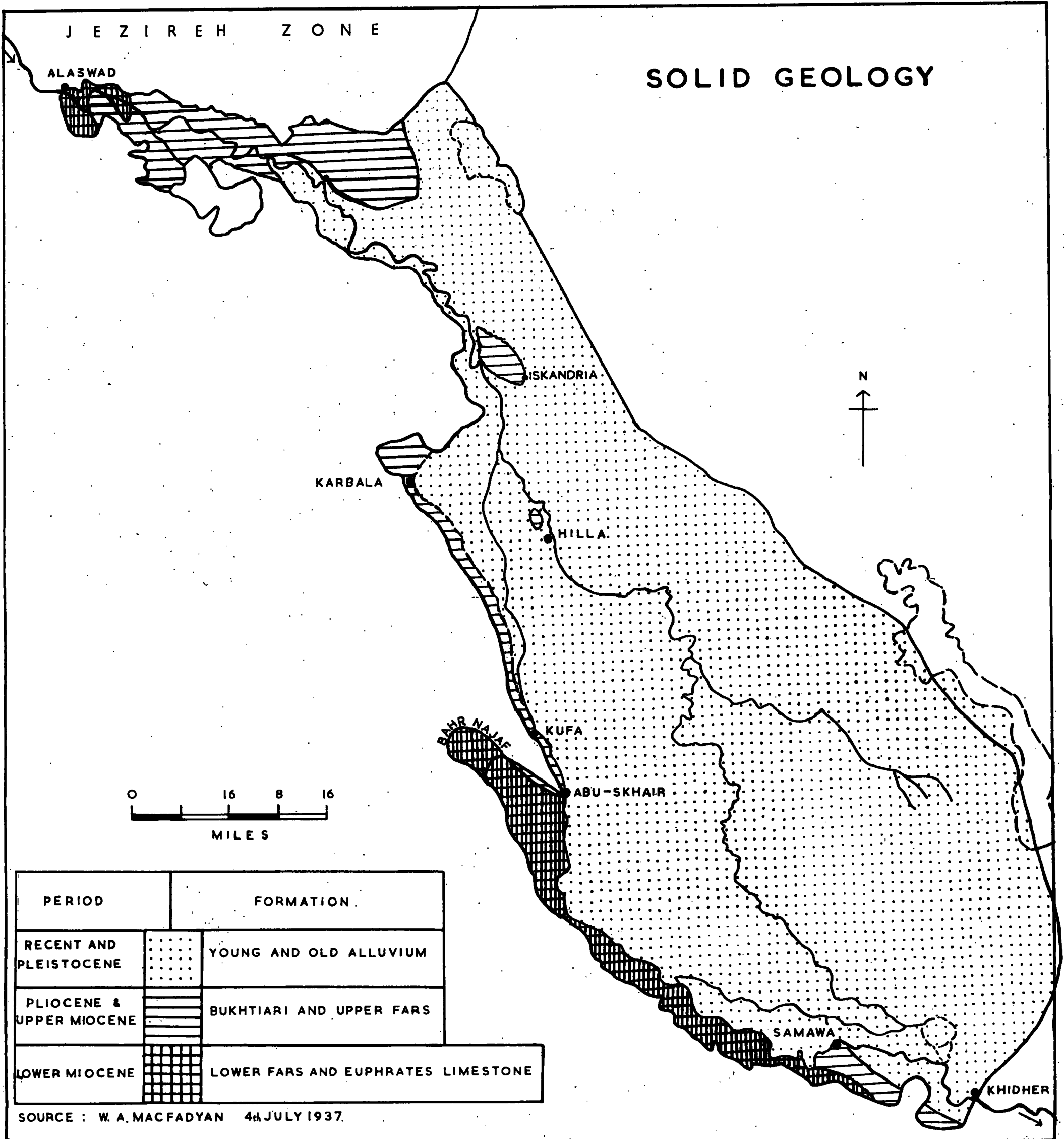
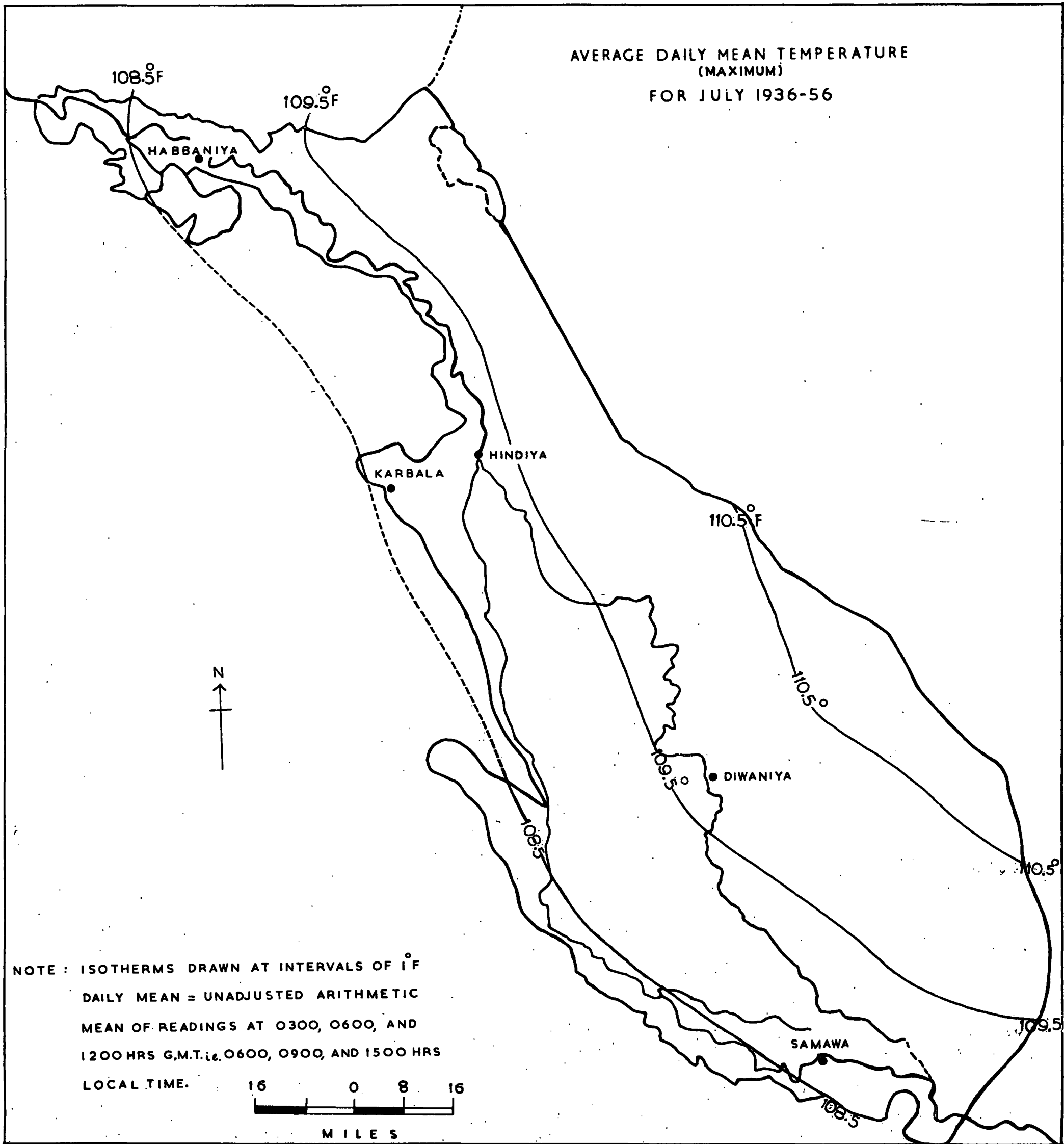

FOR JULY 1936-56

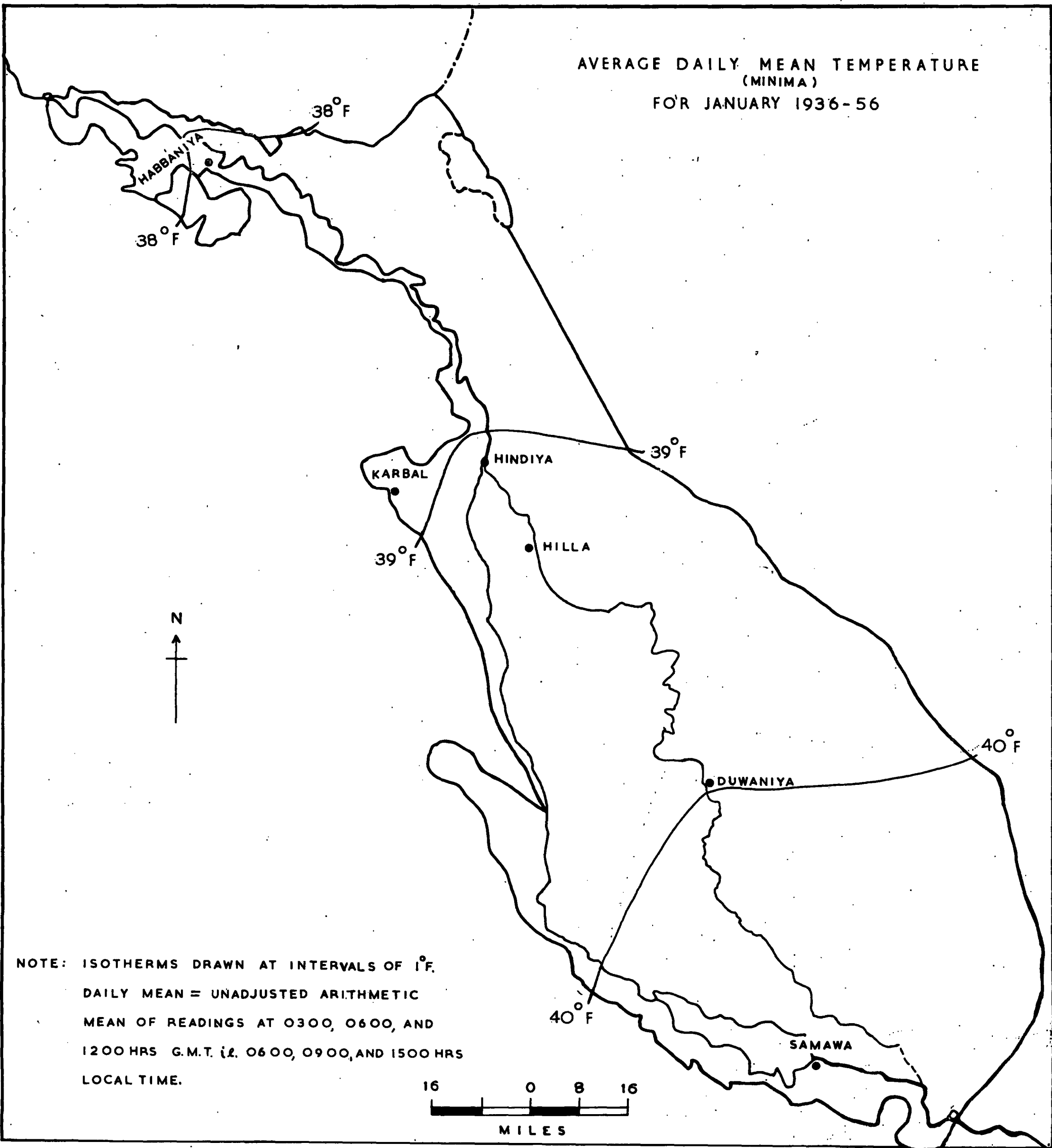

FOR JANUARY 1936-56

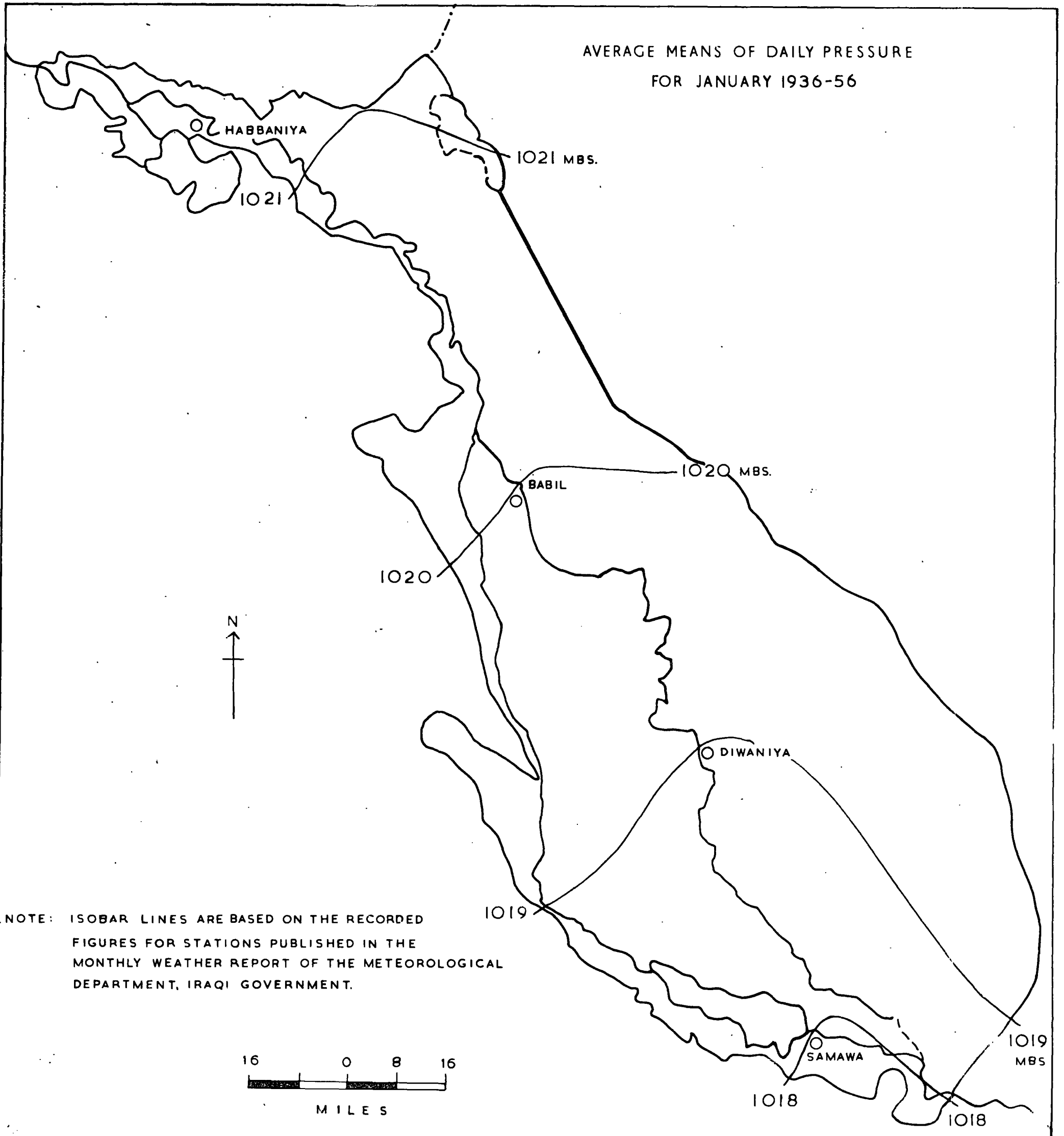

 JANUARY 1936-56

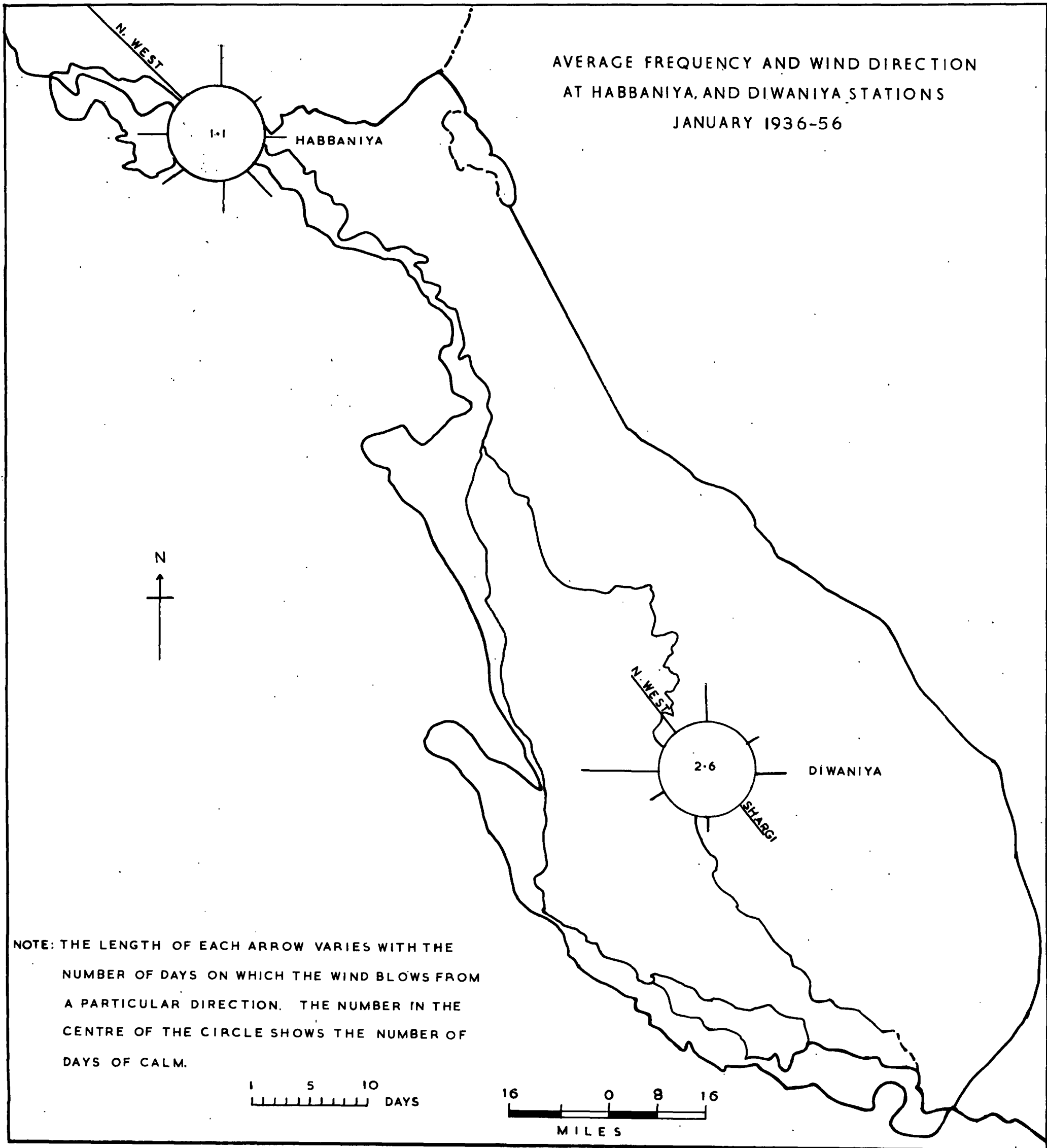
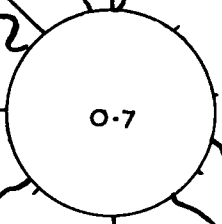
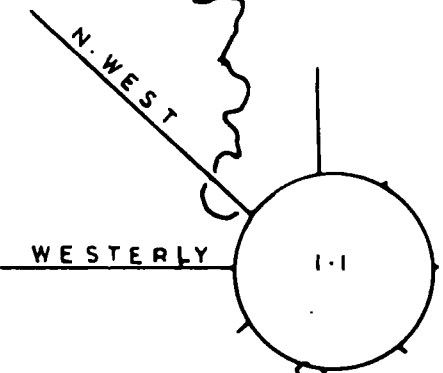

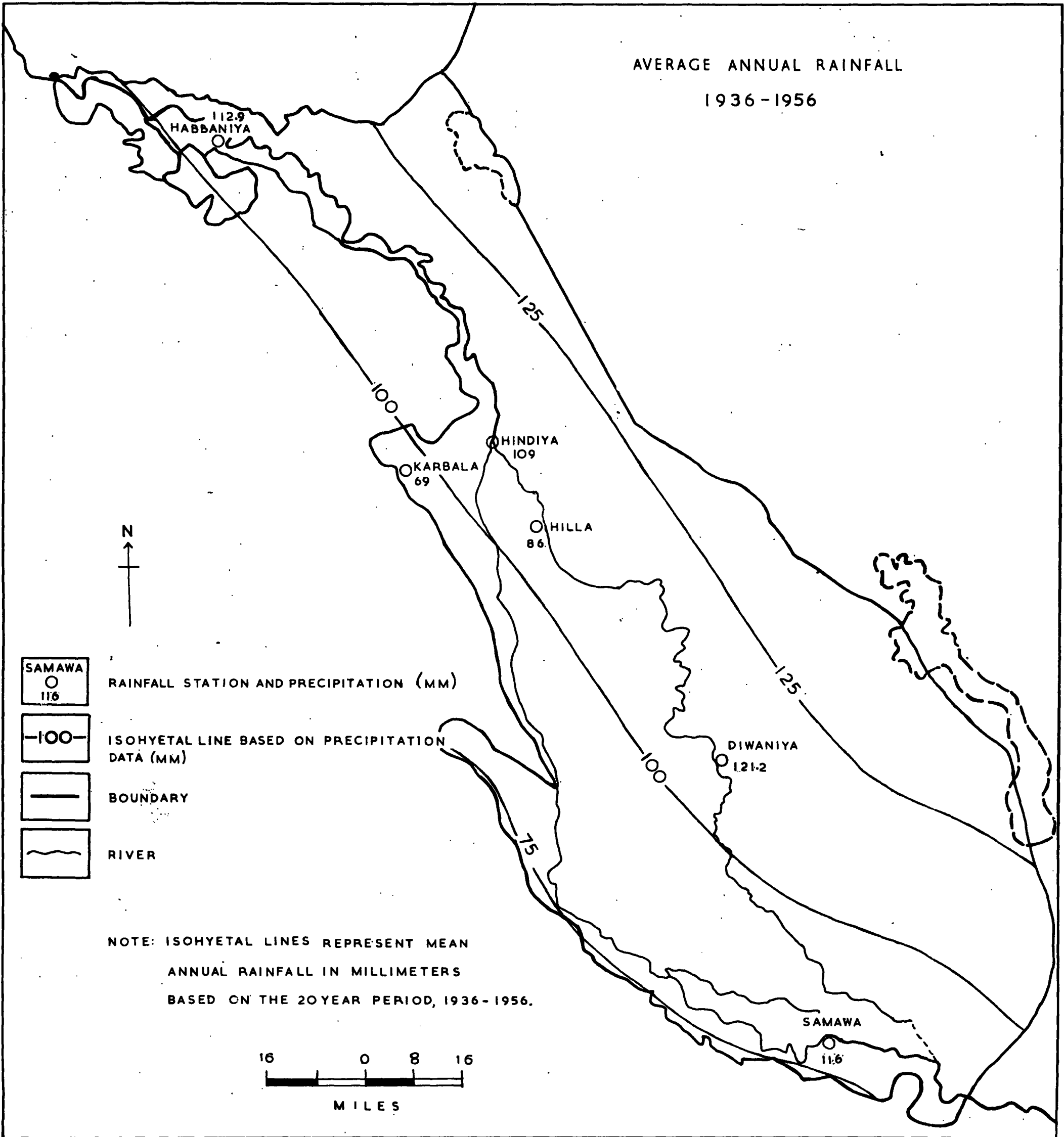

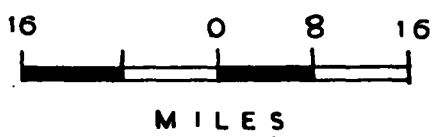

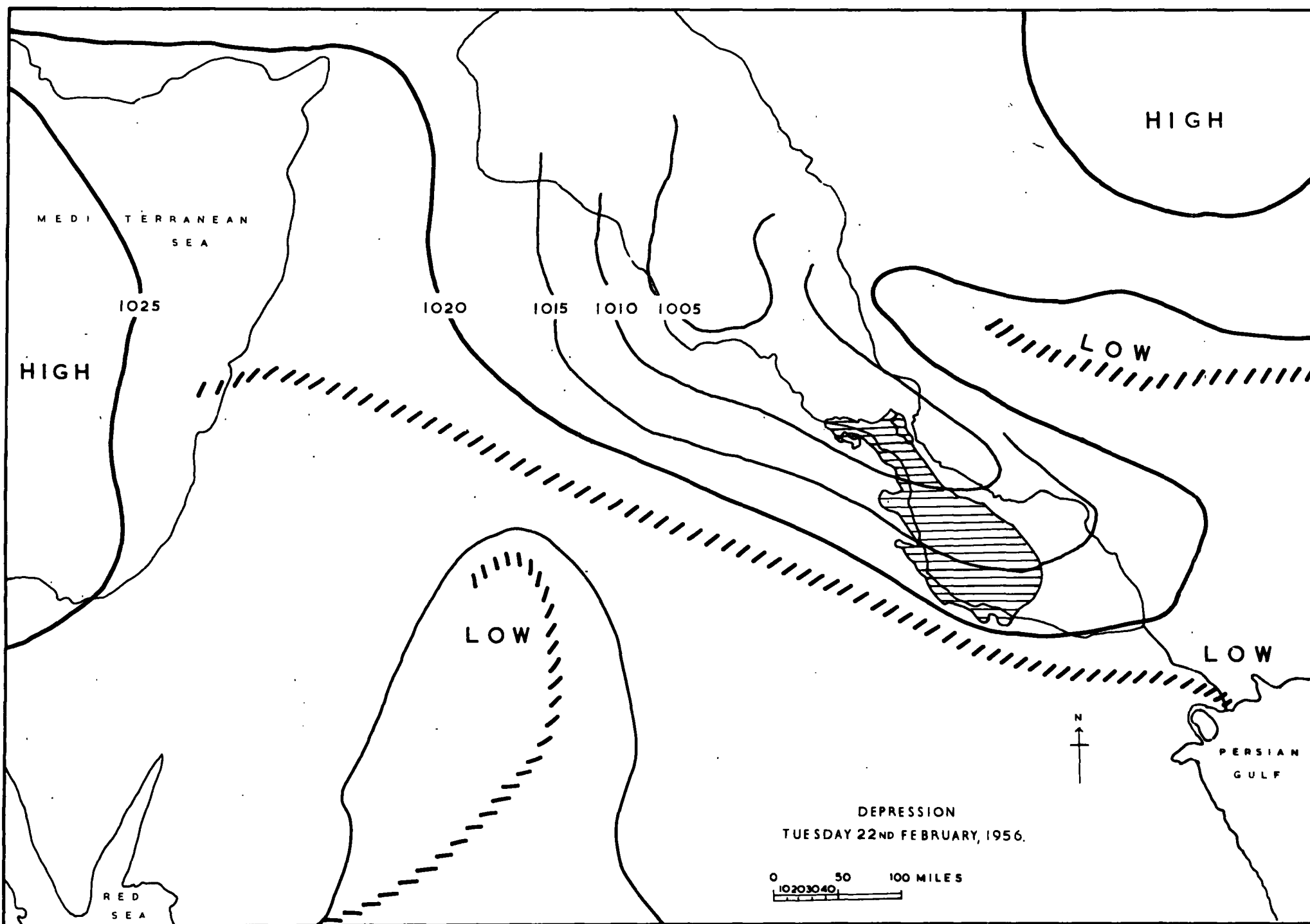

1936-1956

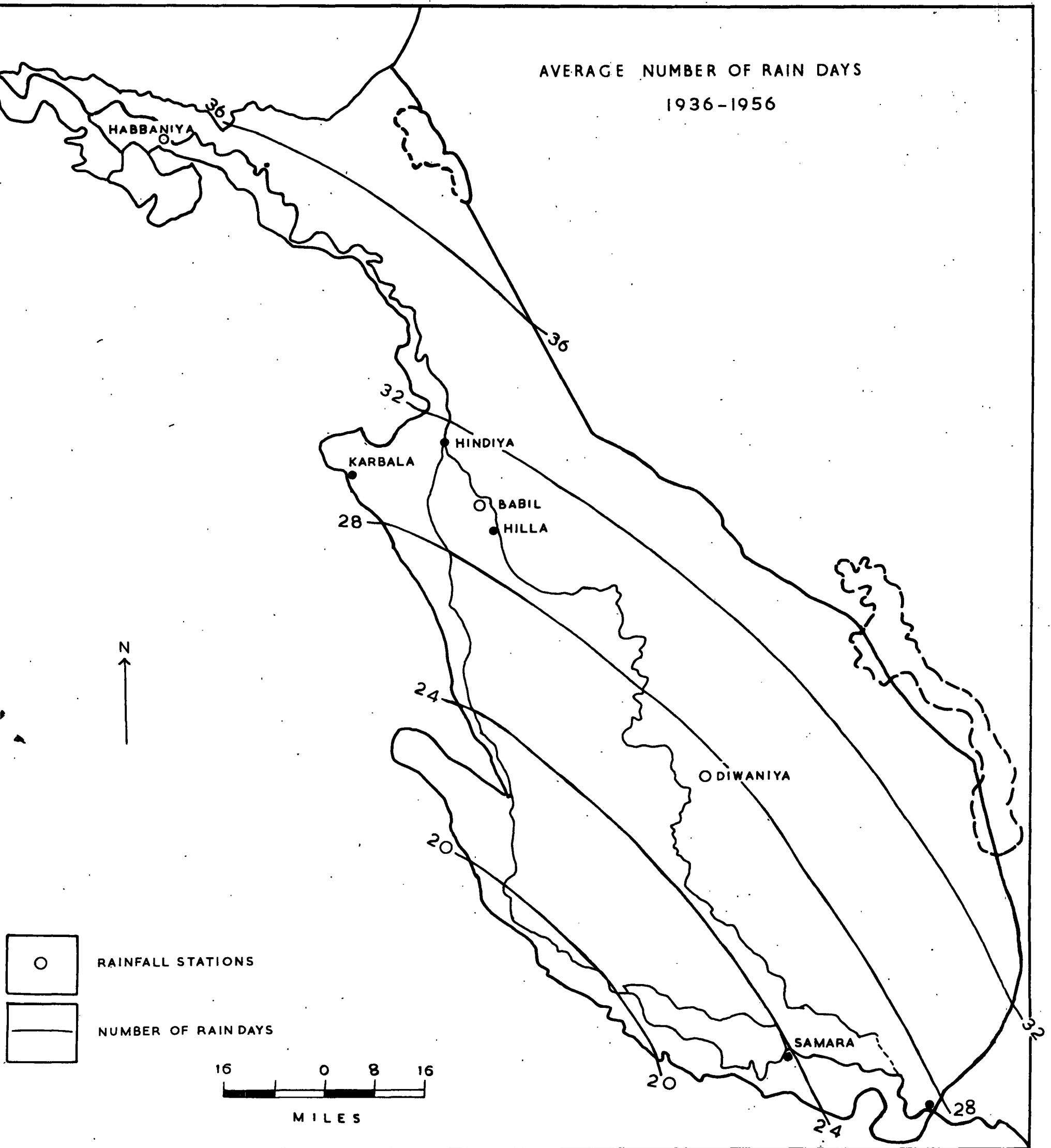

FOR JULY 1936-56

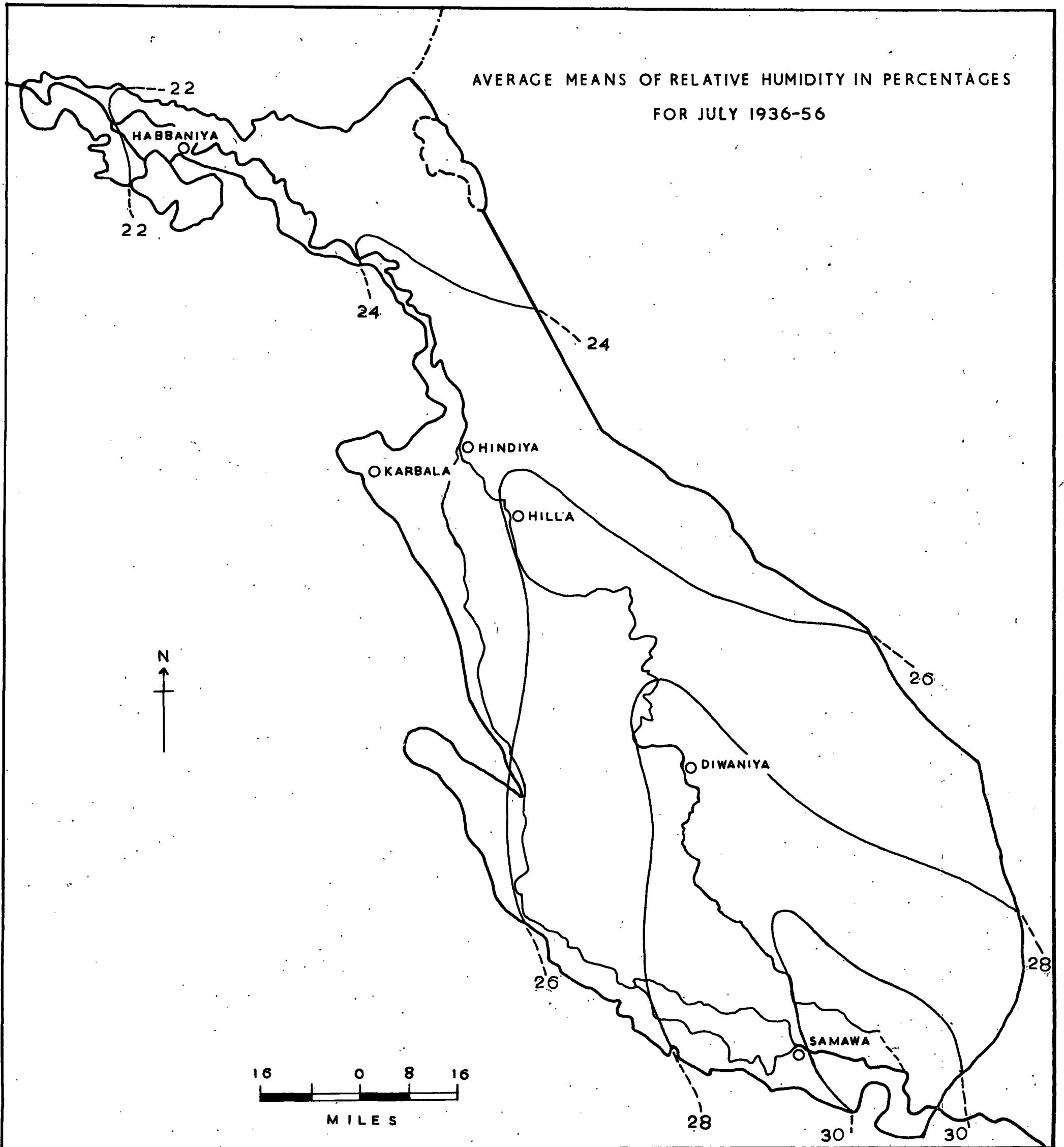

FOR JANUARY 1936-56

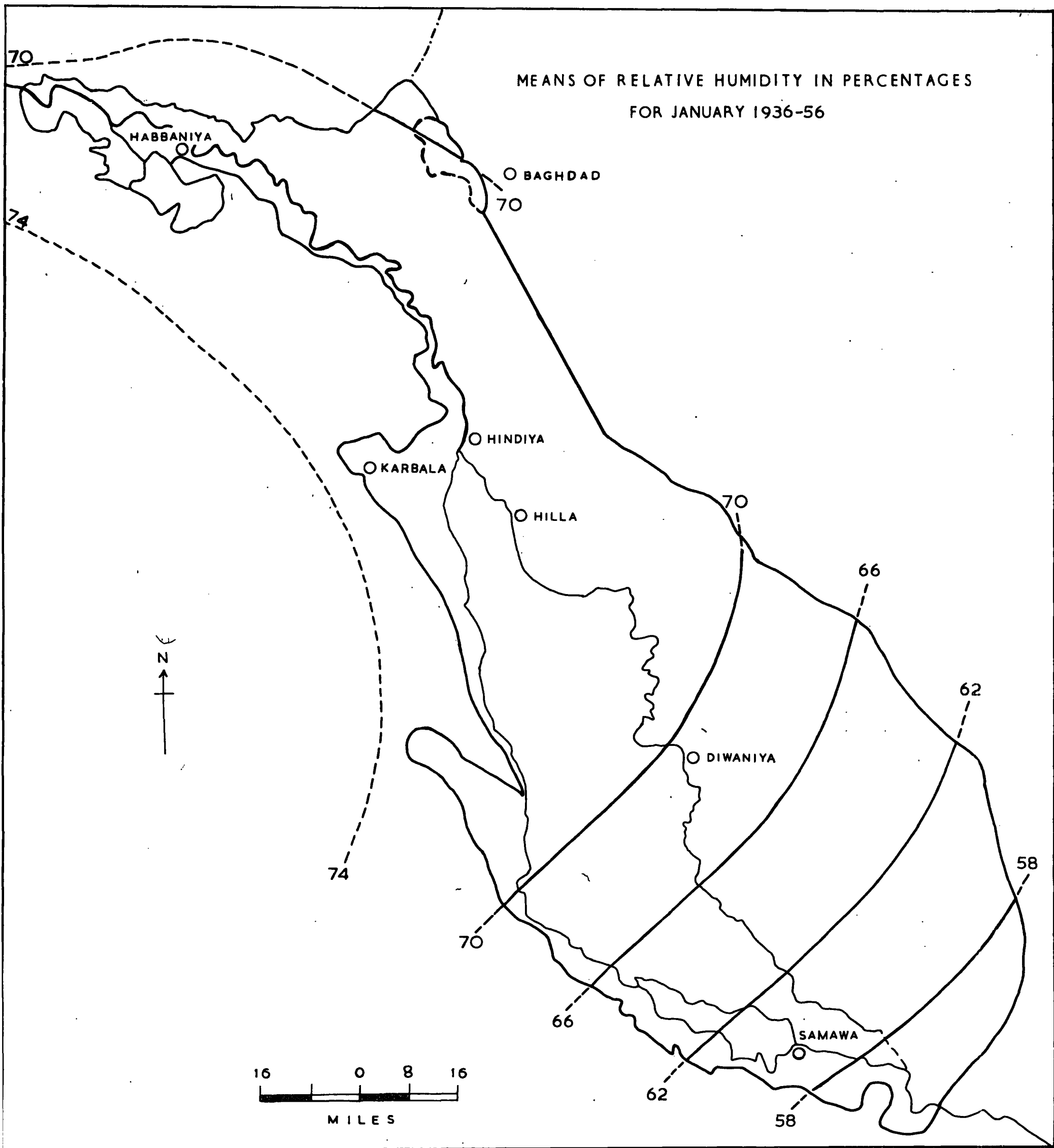
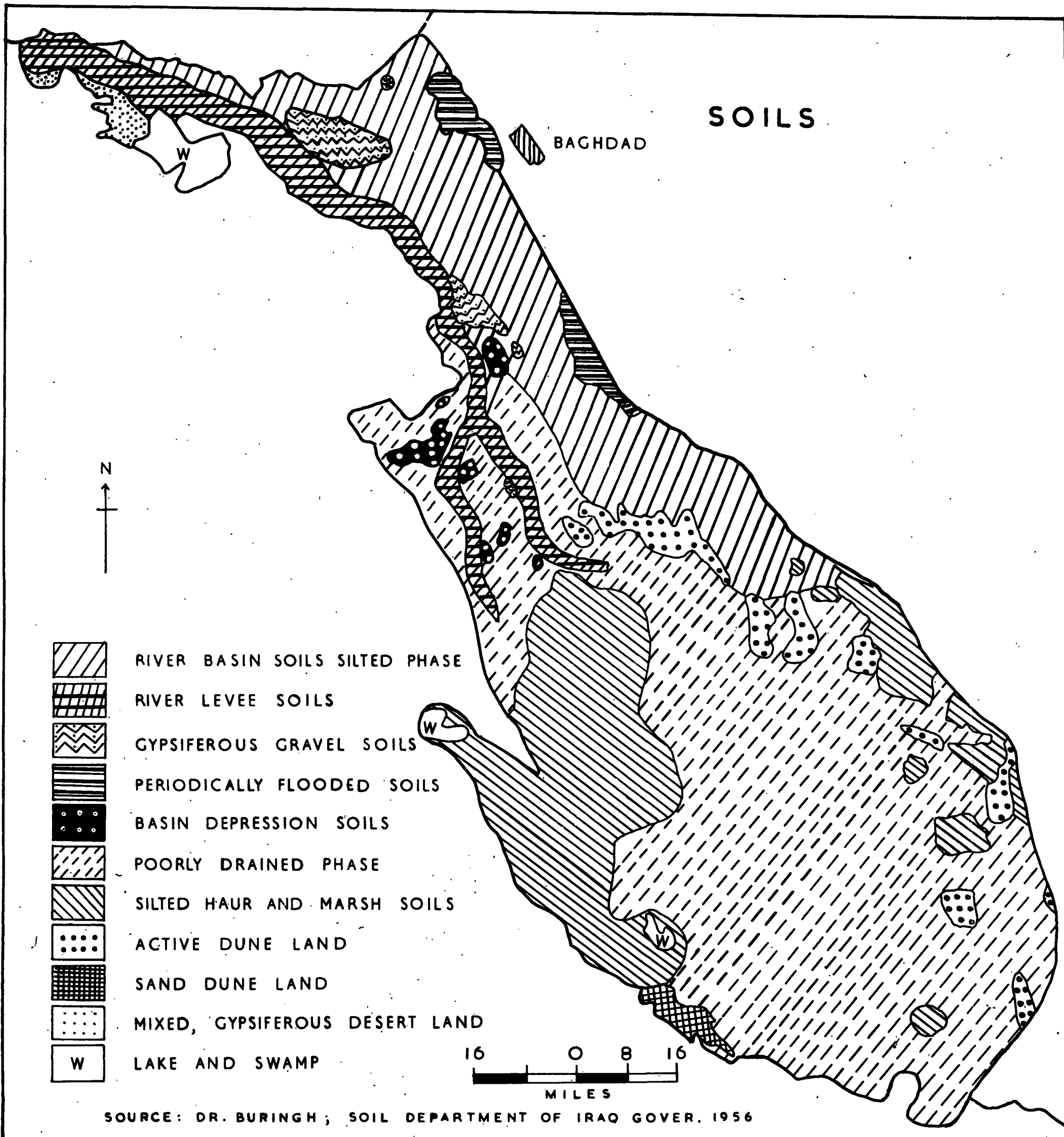

LAND CLASSIFICATION, 1957

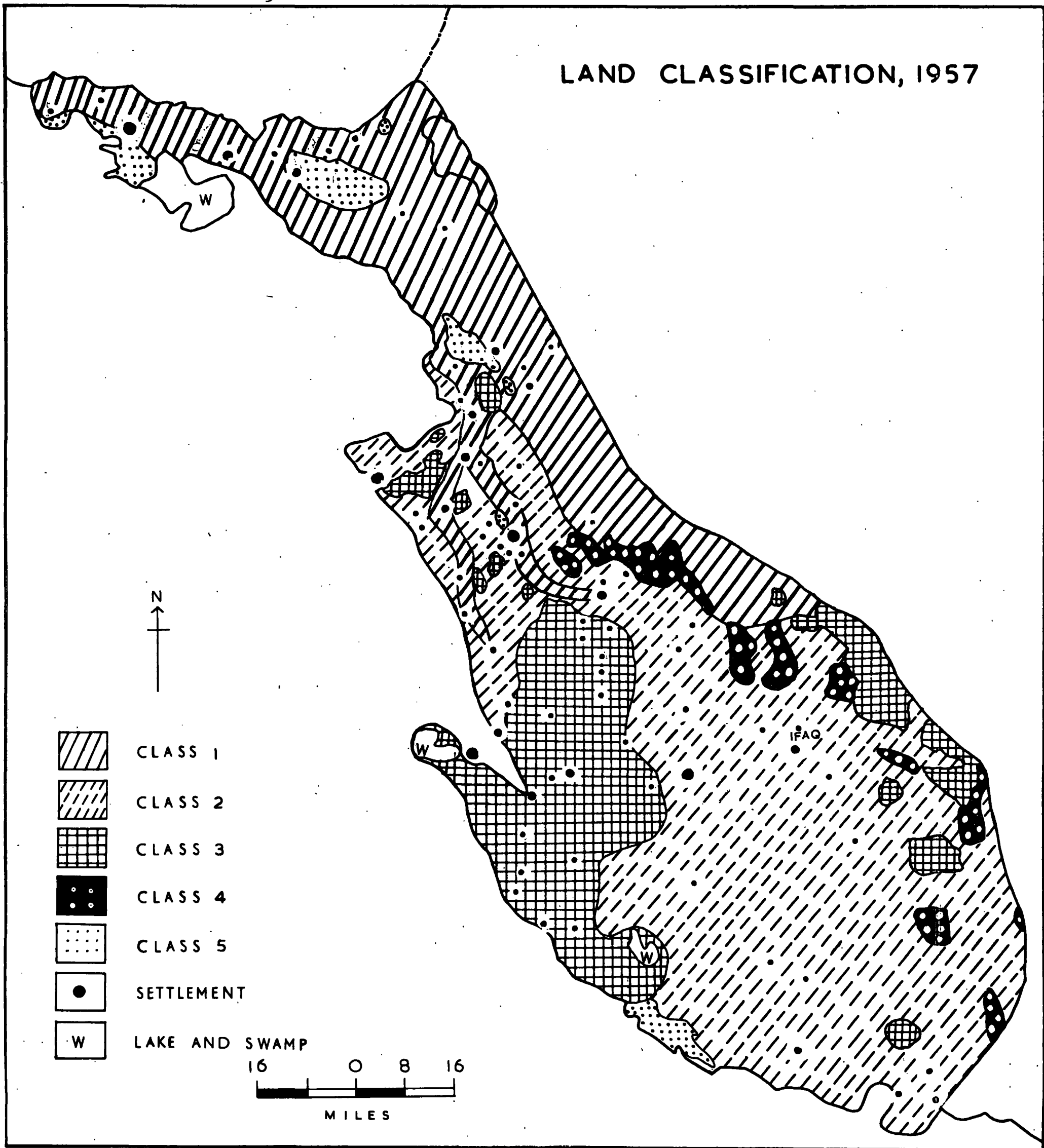
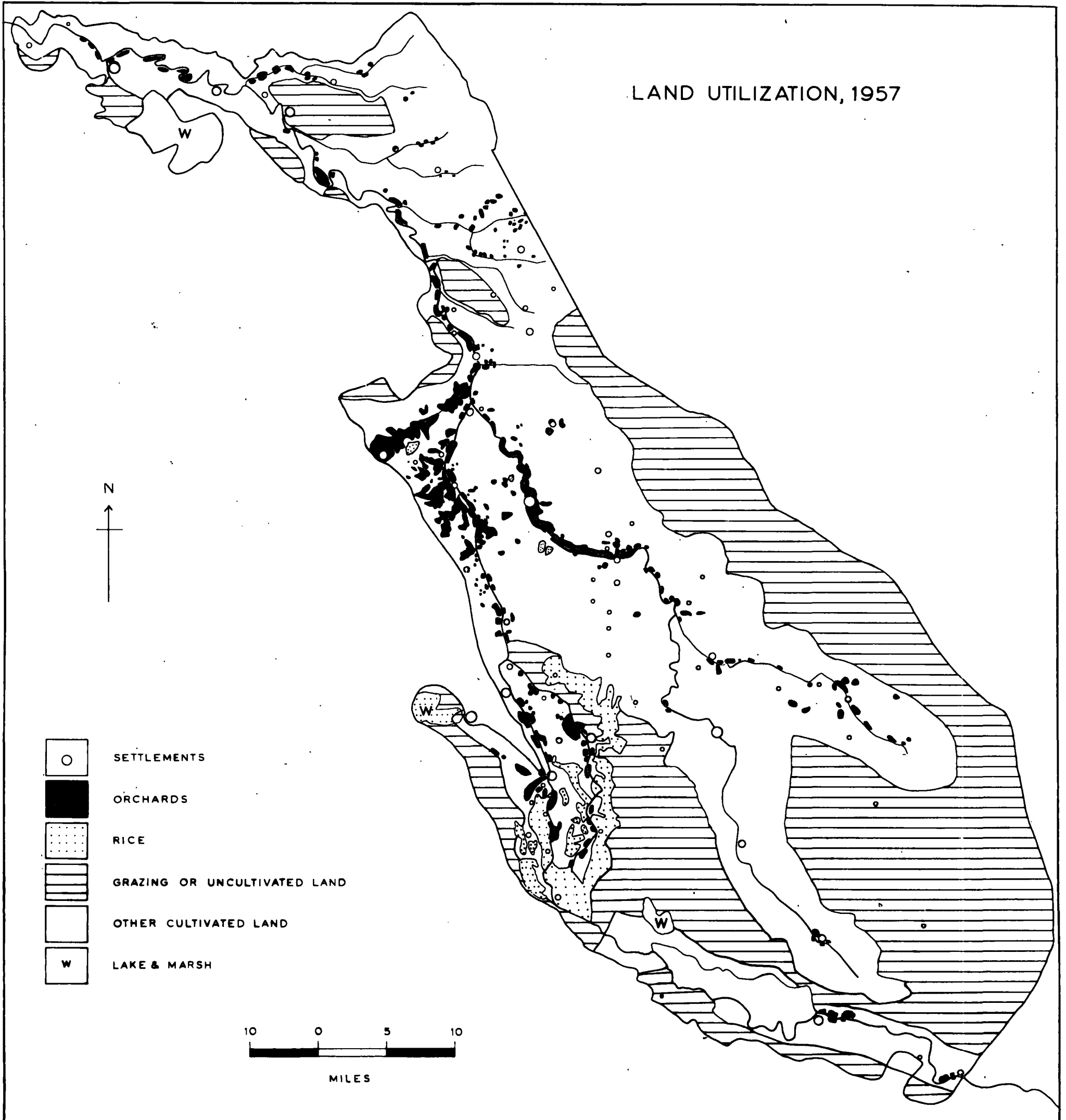

LAND UTILIZATION, 1957

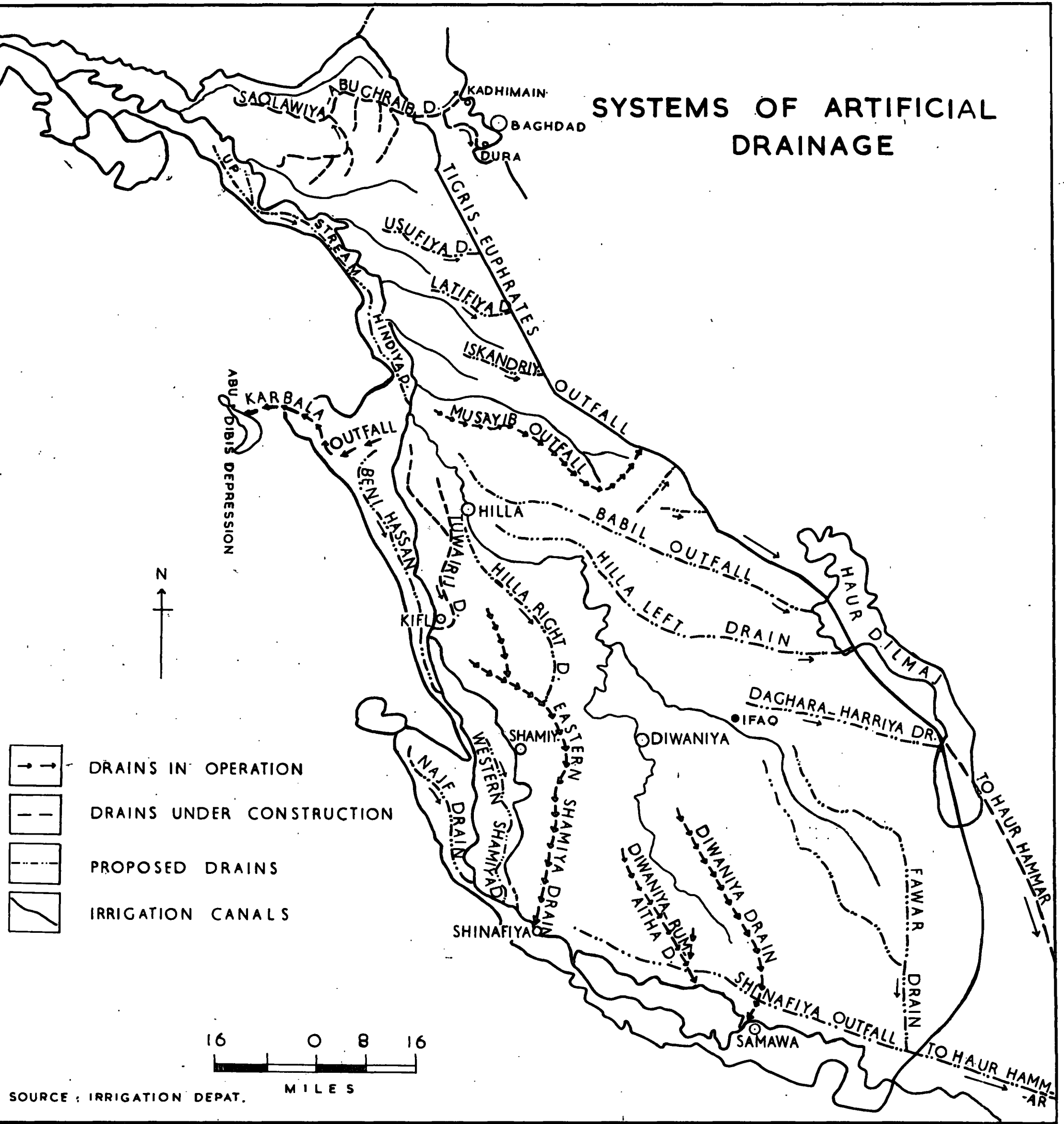






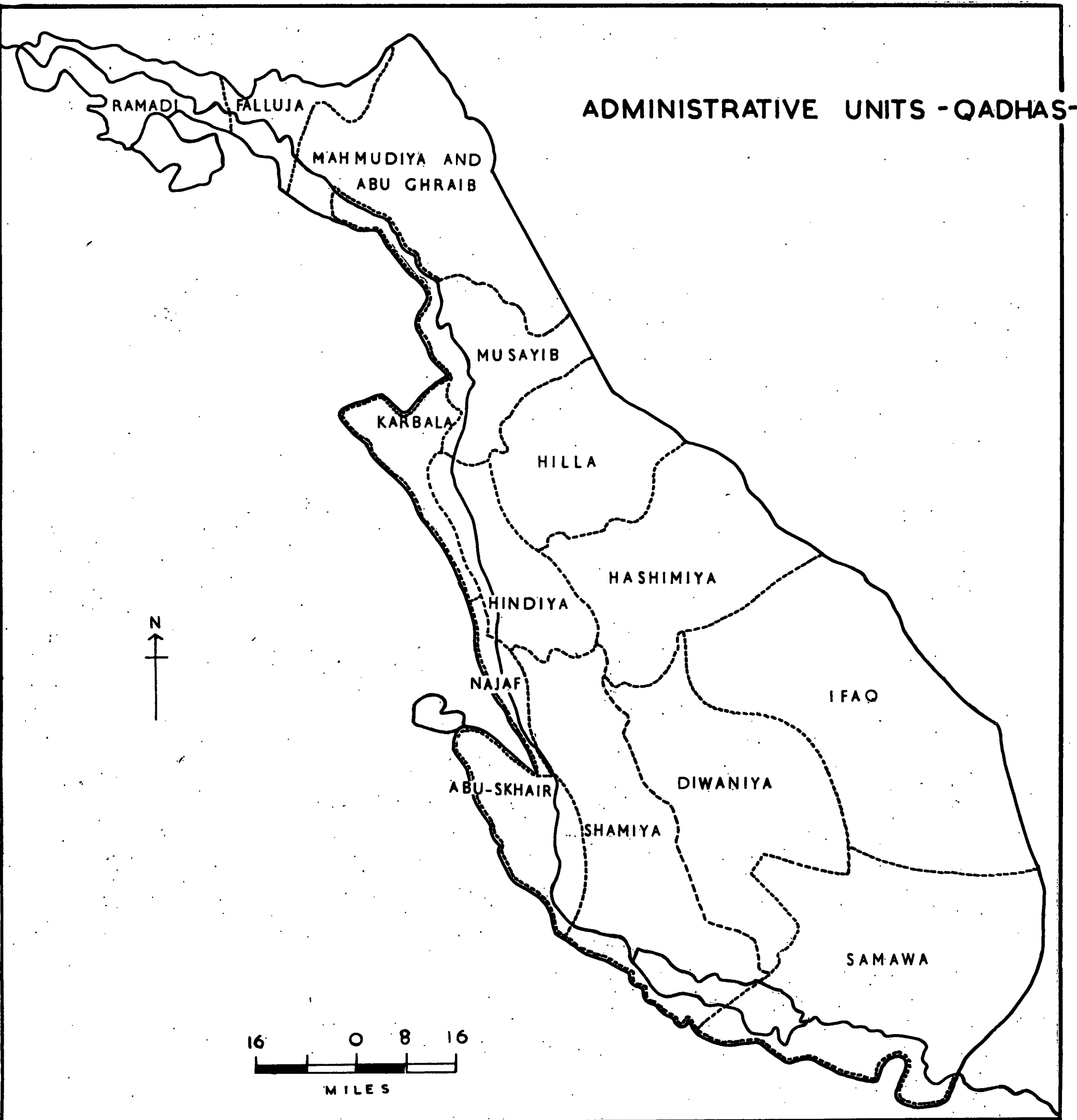

POPULATION DENSITY, 1957

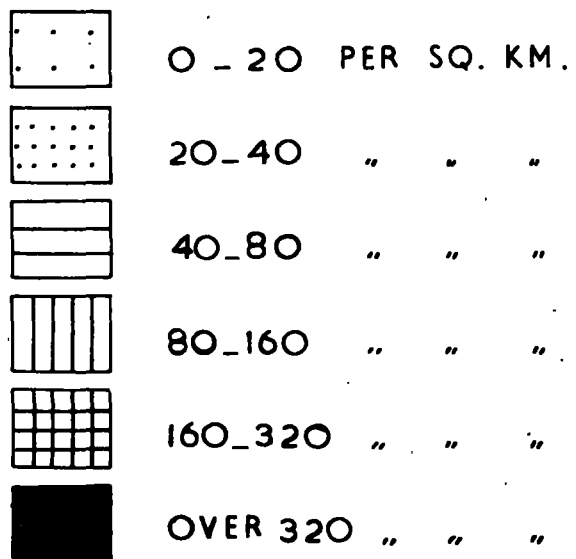

AREAS OF SOIL SALINITY (LOCATION OF PROJECT AREAS)

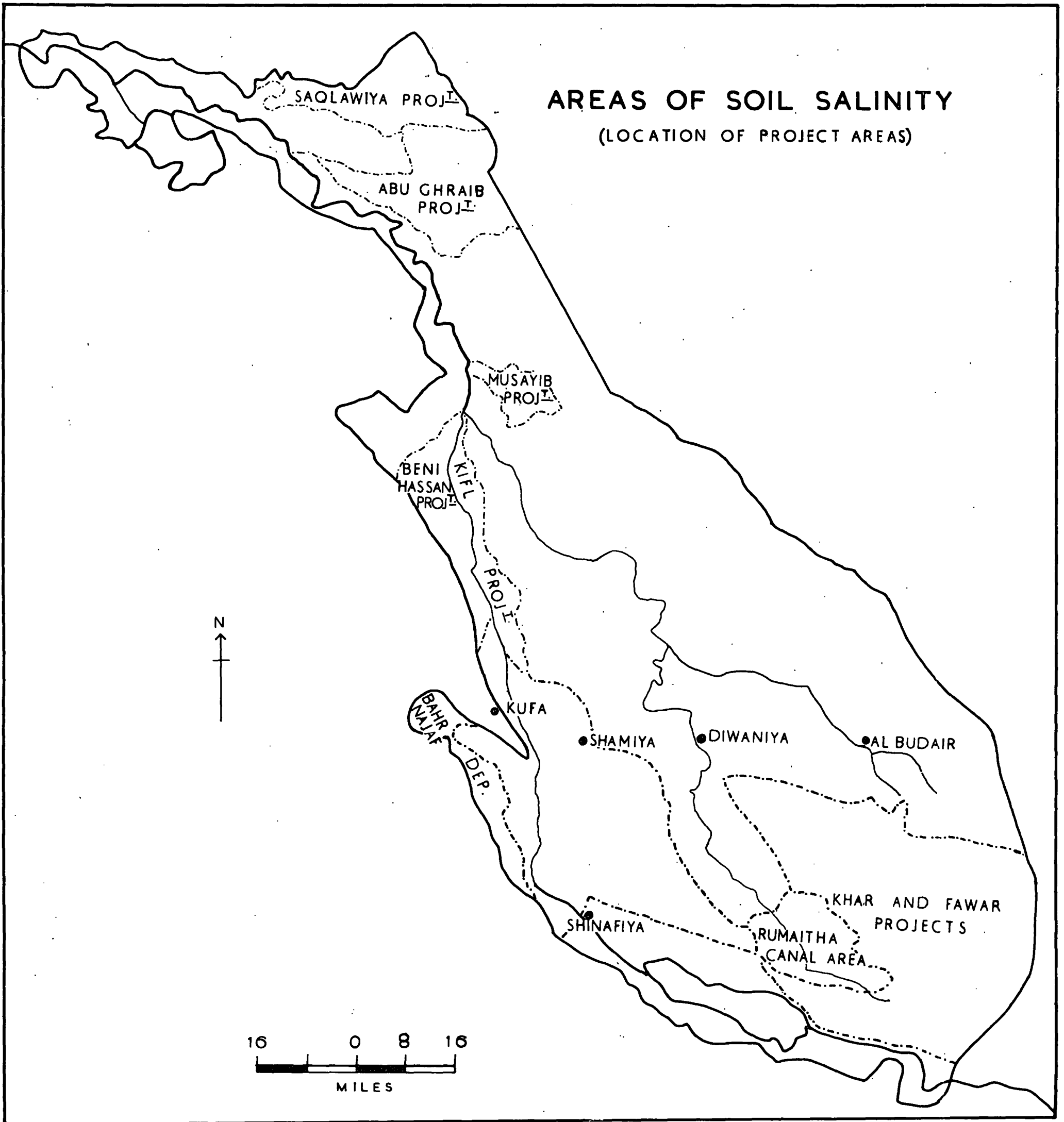

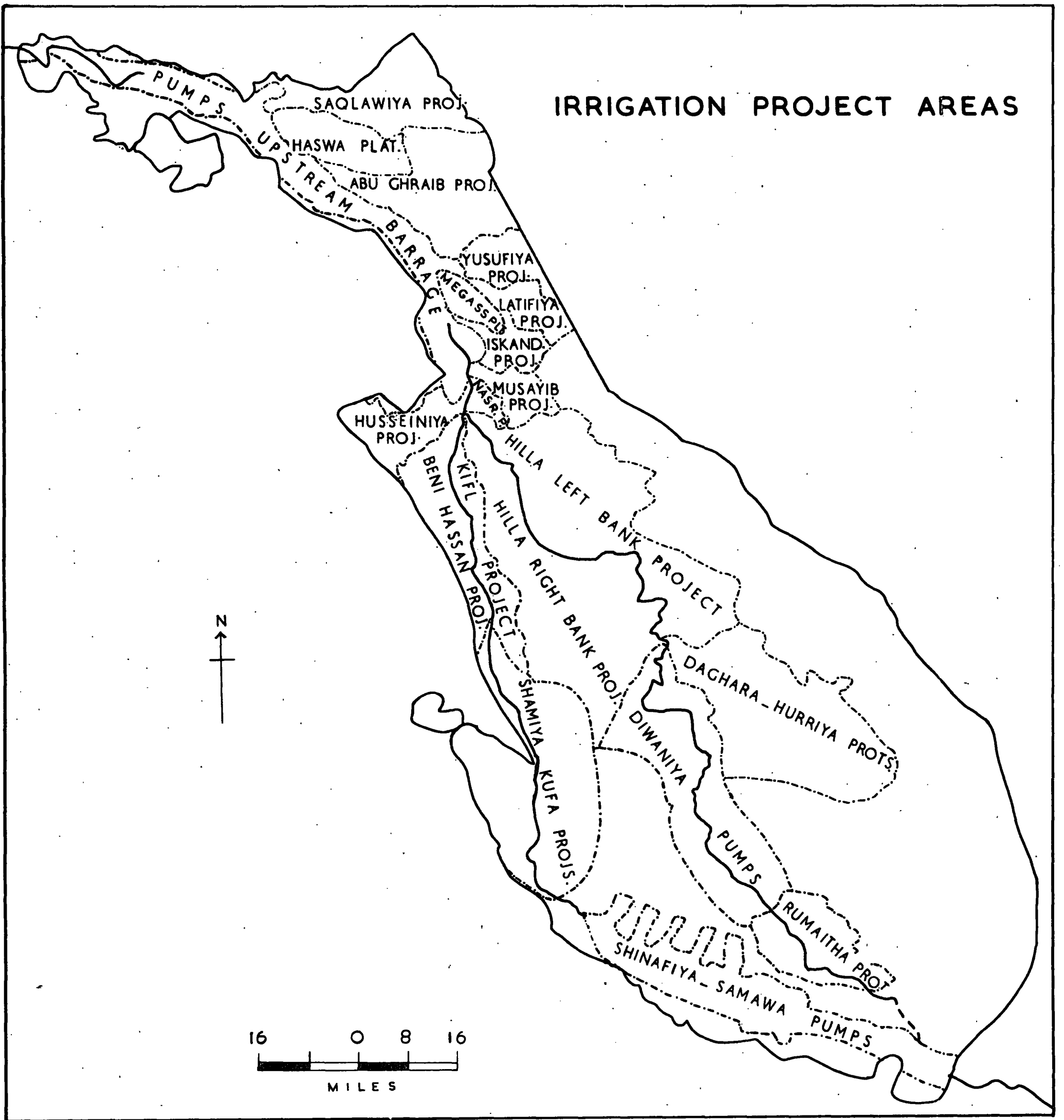

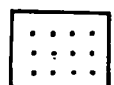
METHODS OF IRRIGATION EMPLOYED



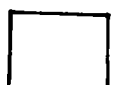
FLOODING IRRIGATION AREAS

PROPOSED IRRIGATION PROJECTS

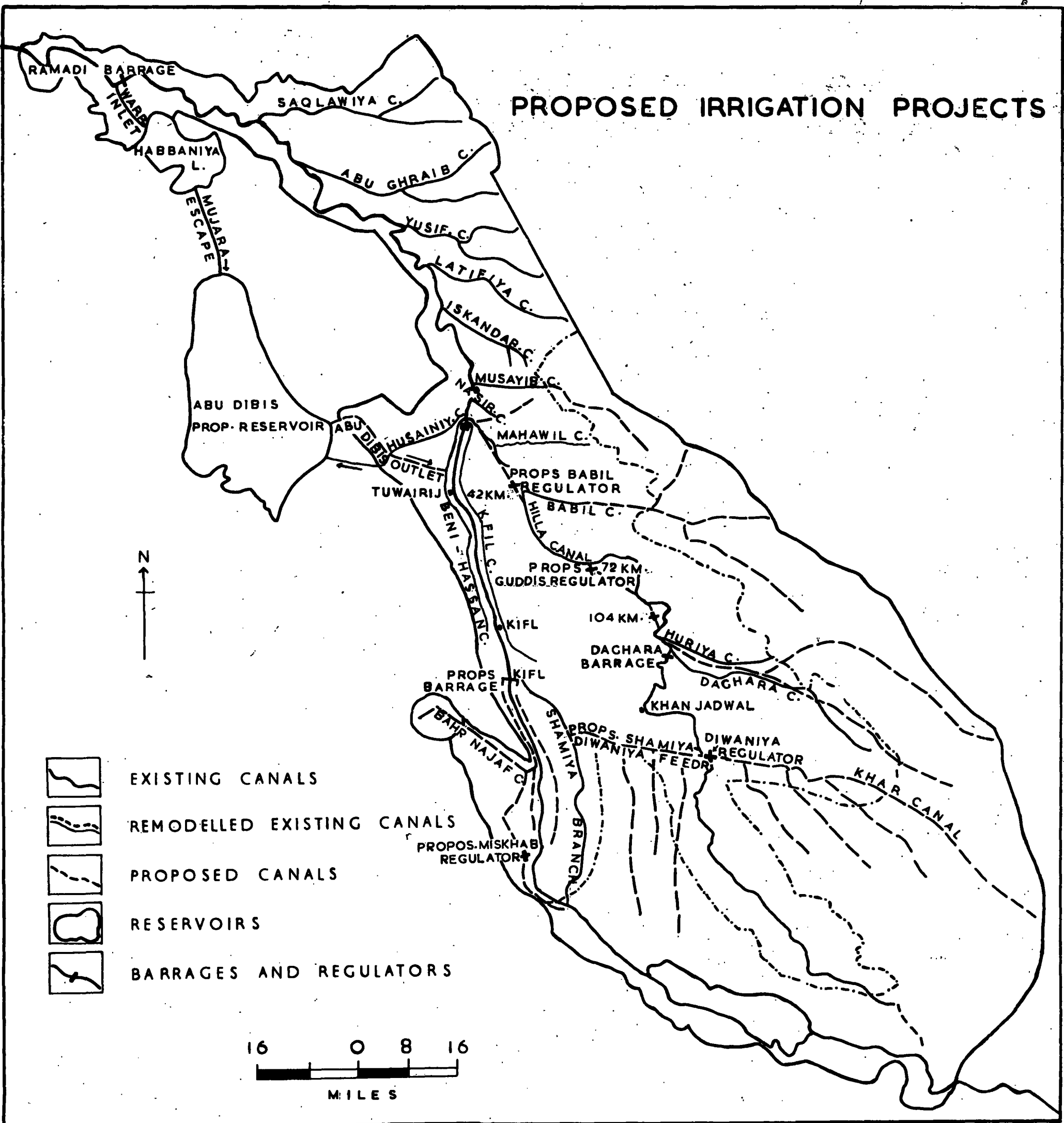

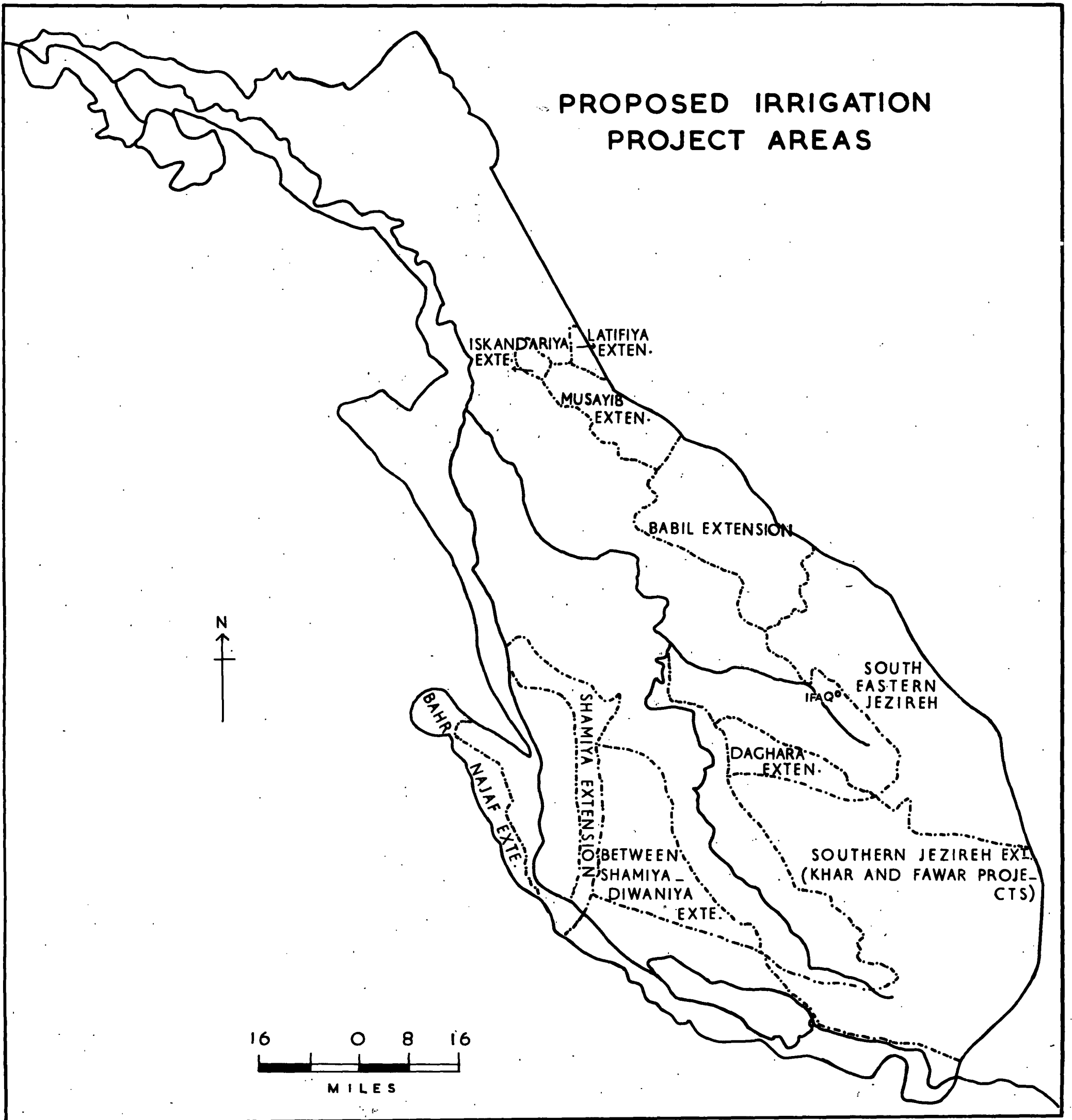

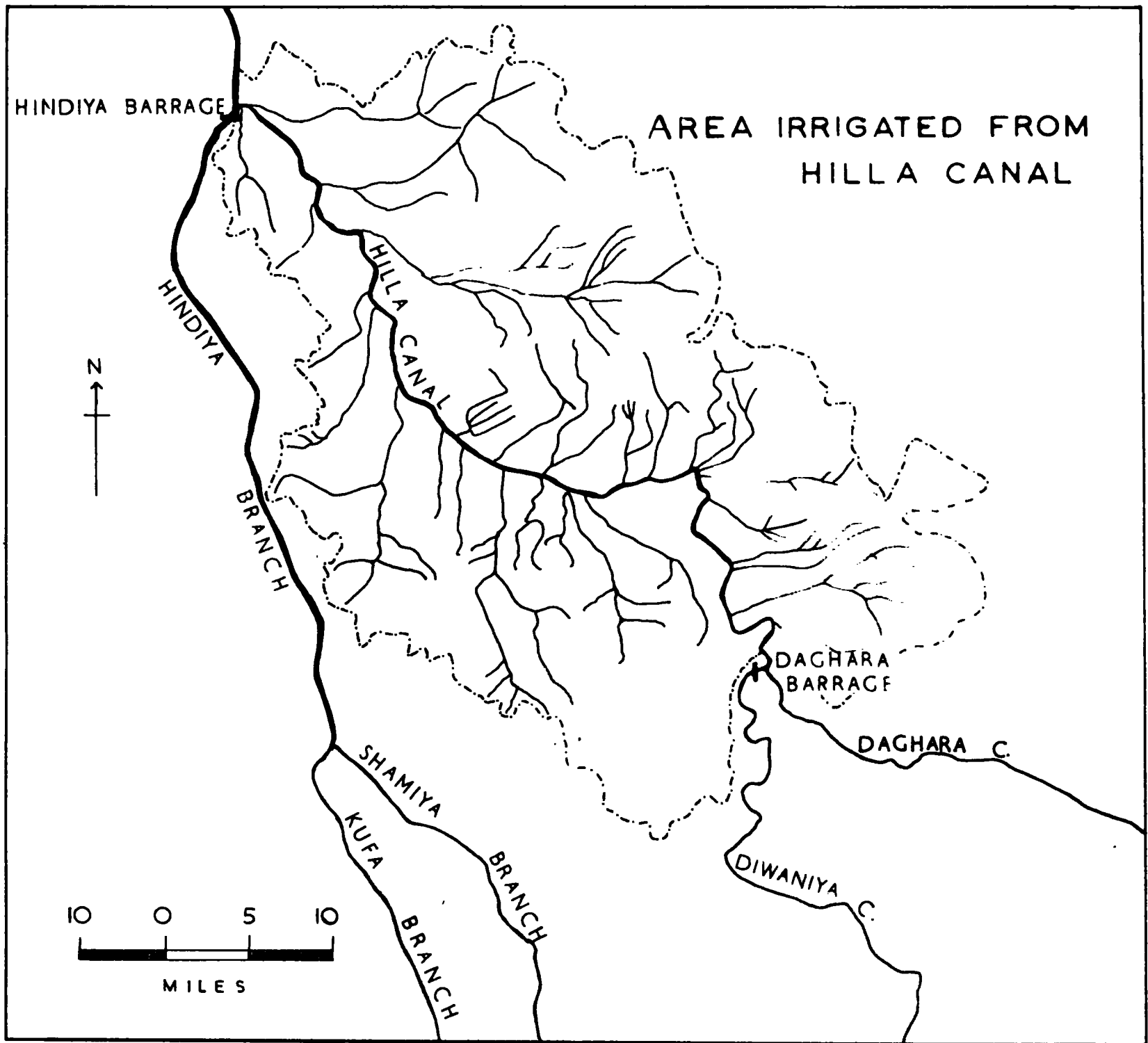

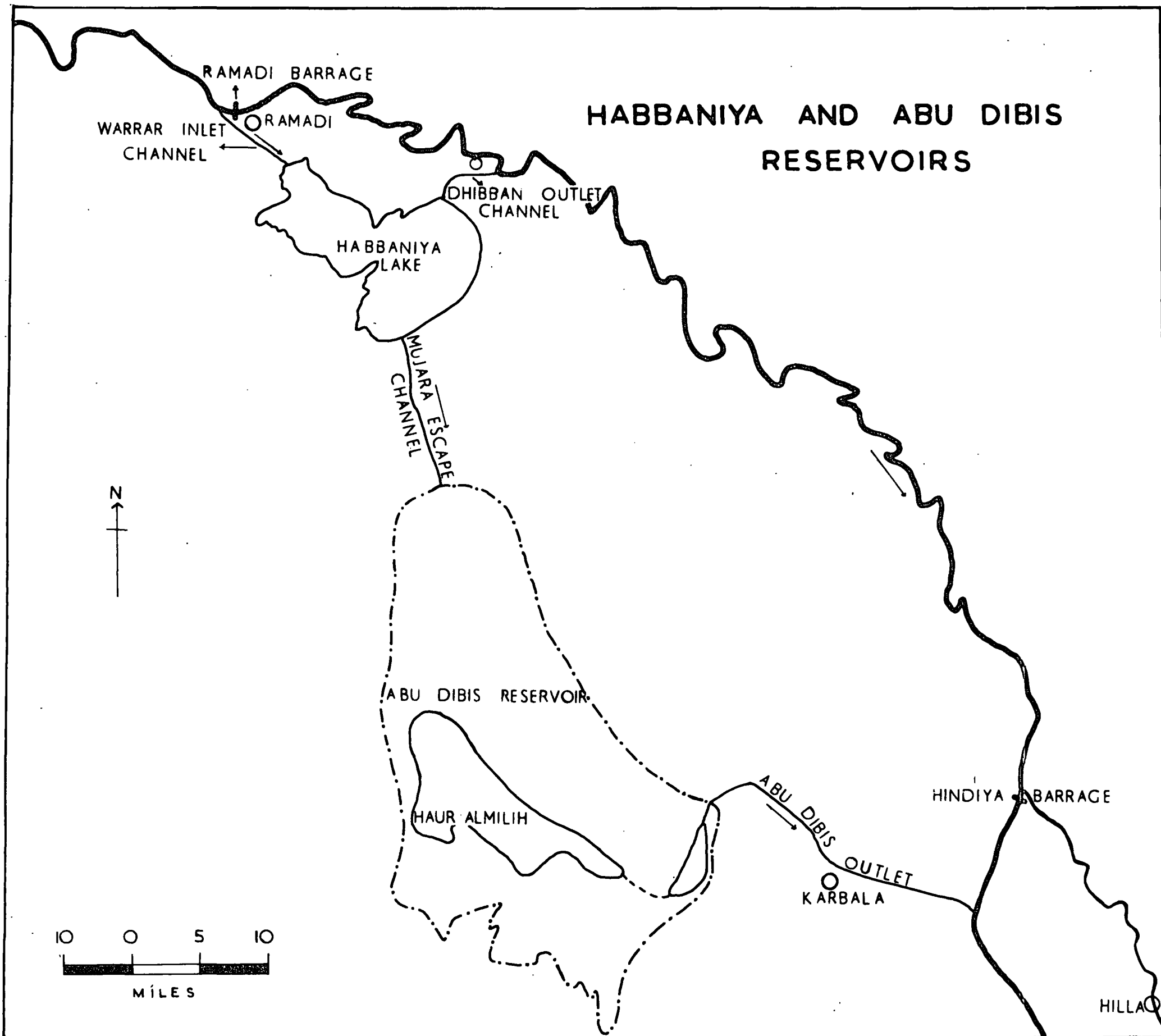

AGRICULTURAL REGIONS

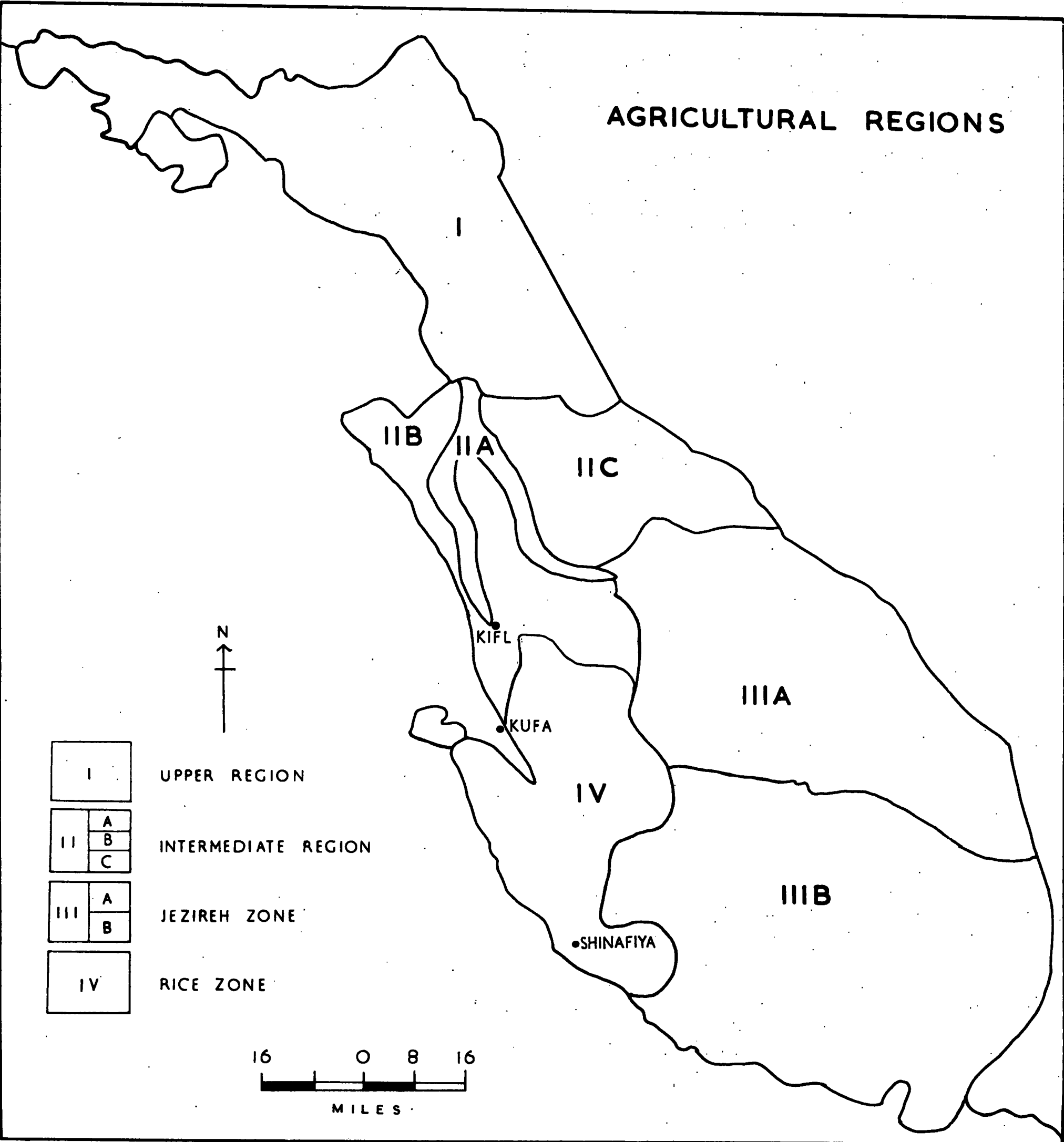

(IN MESHARAS)

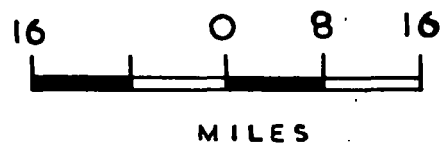
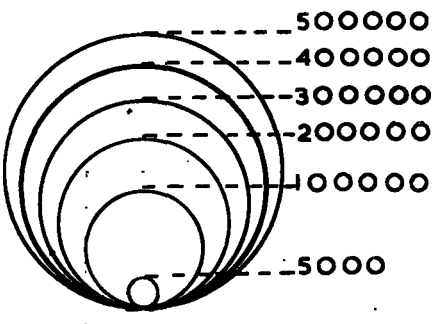

(IN MESHARAS)

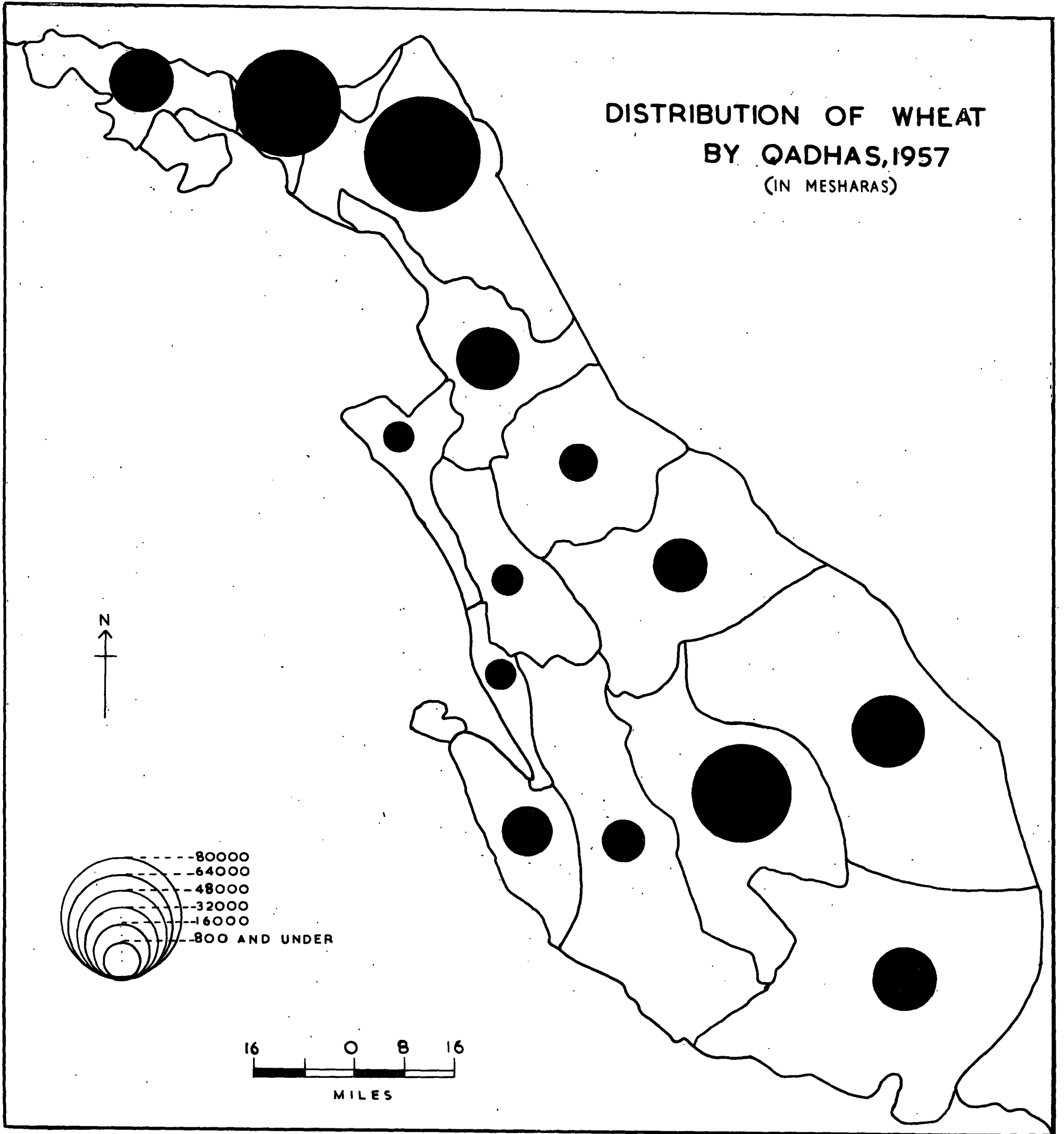

(IN MESHARAS)

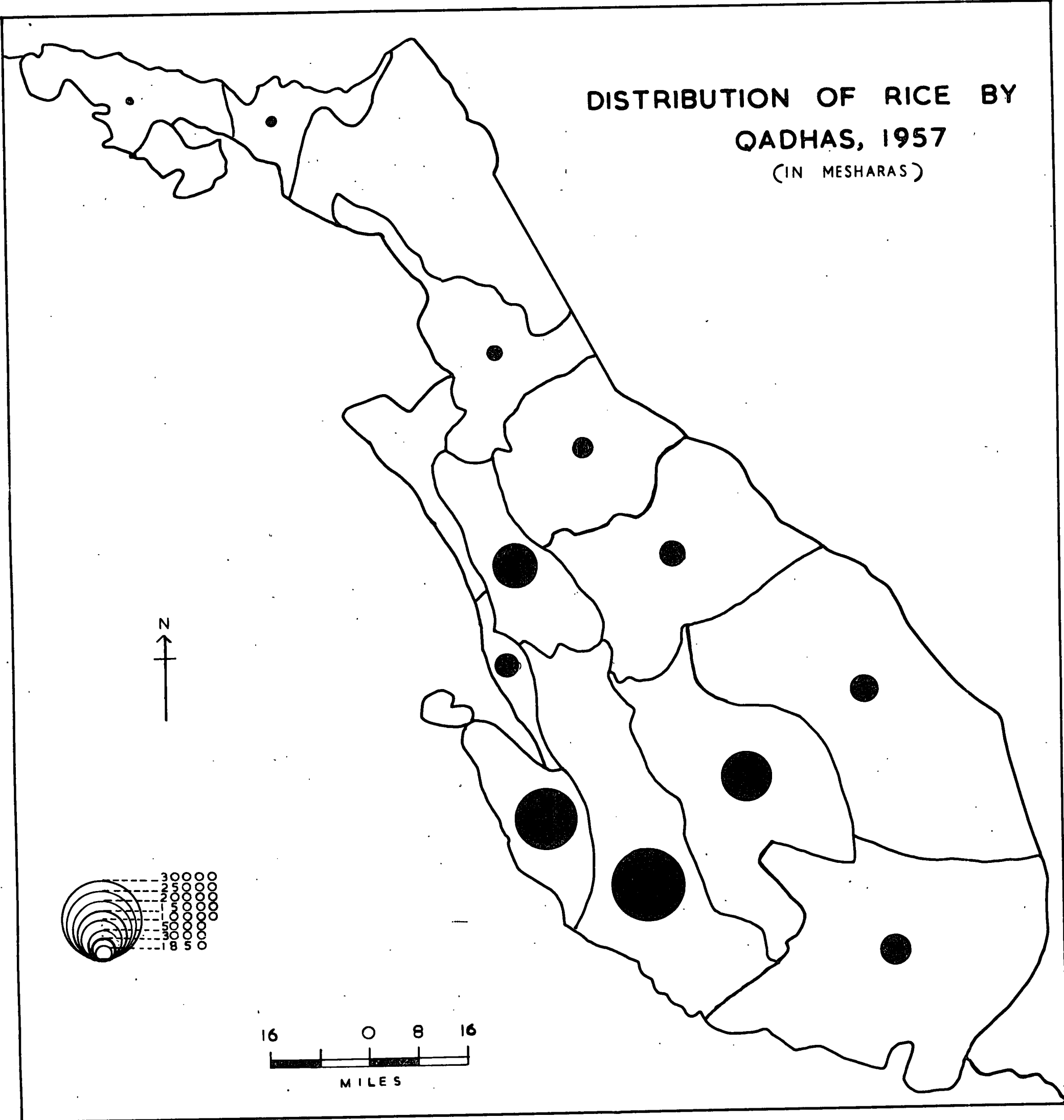

(IN MESHARAS)

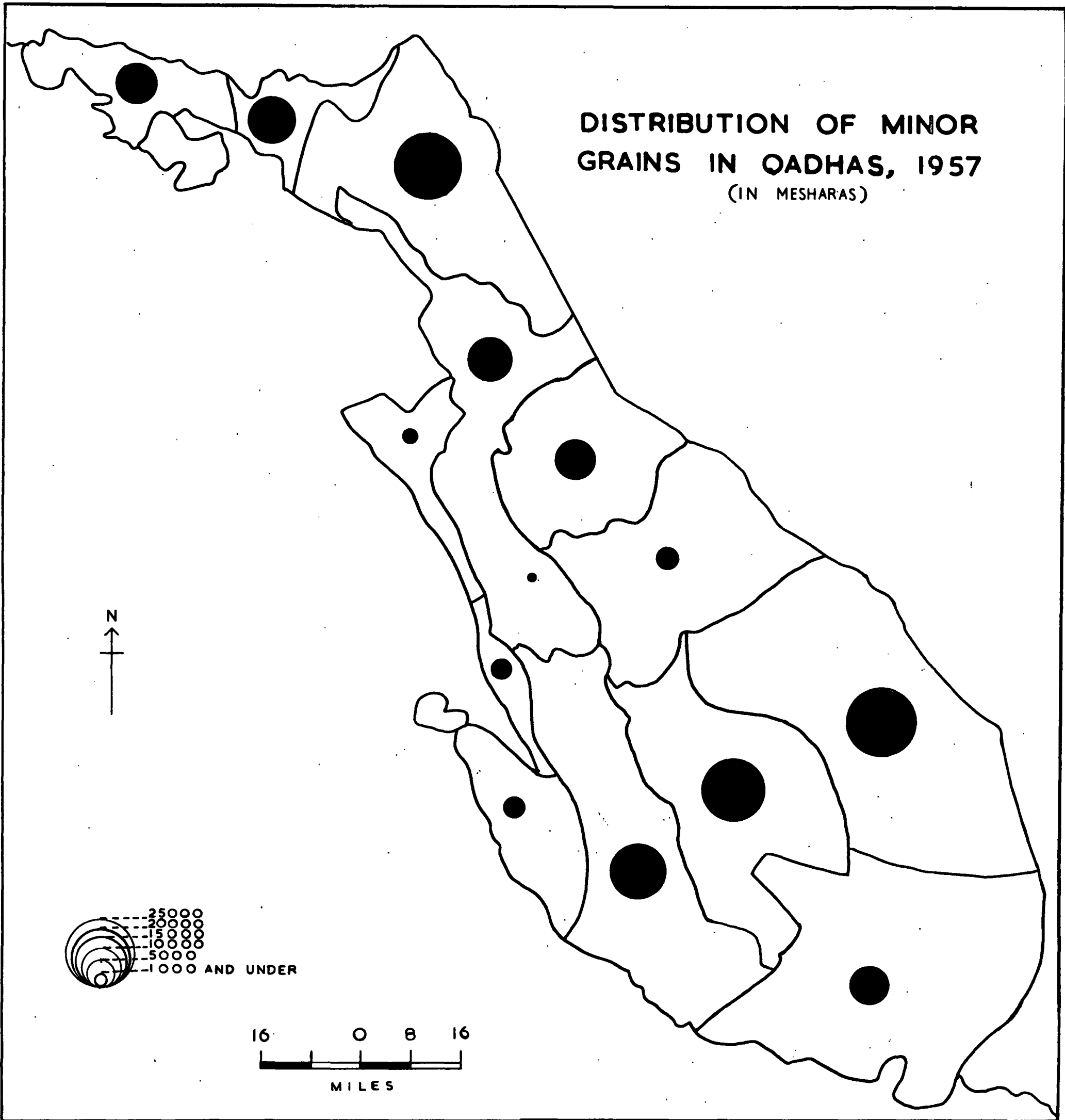

(IN MESHARAS)

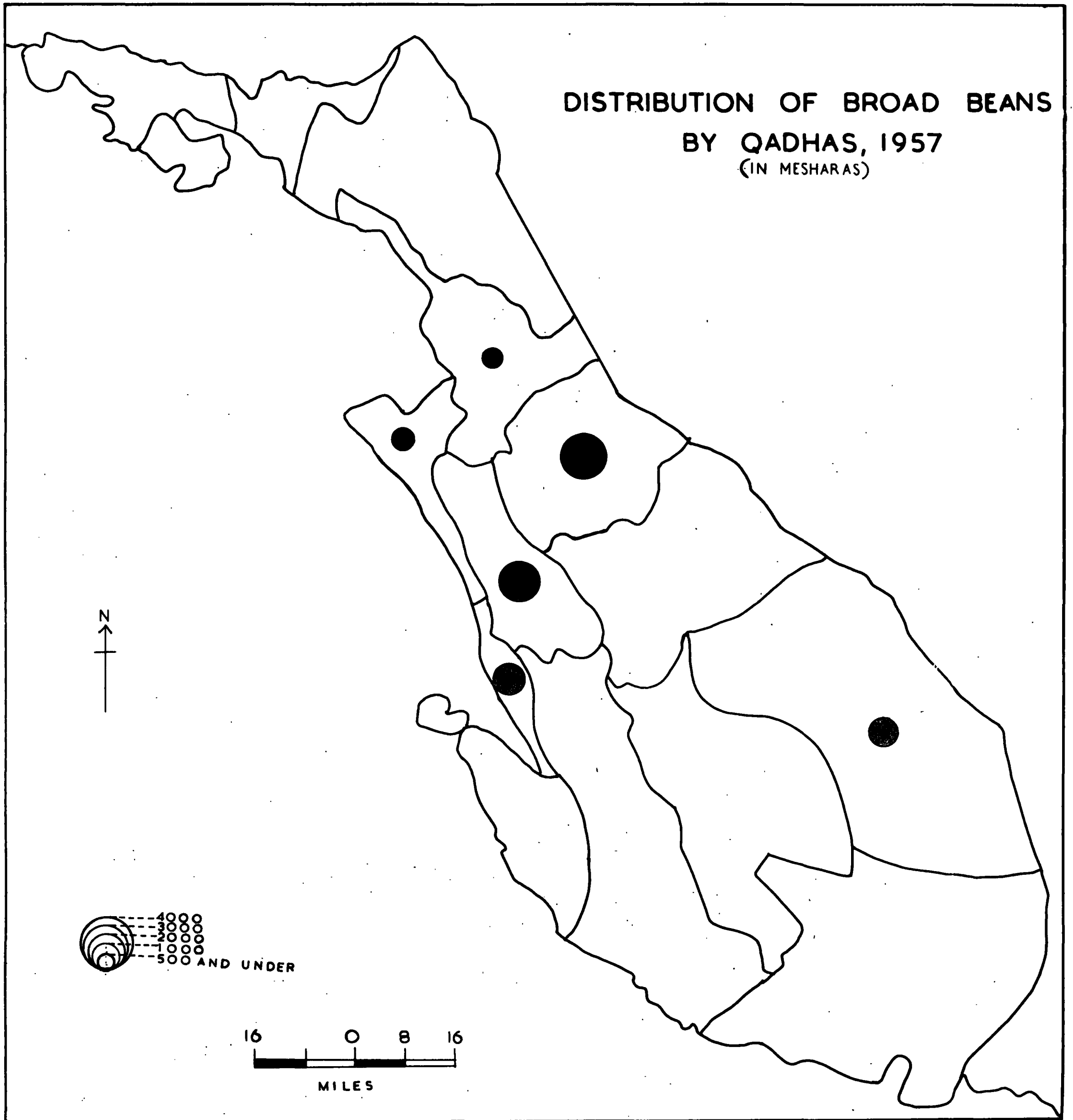

(IN MESHARAS)

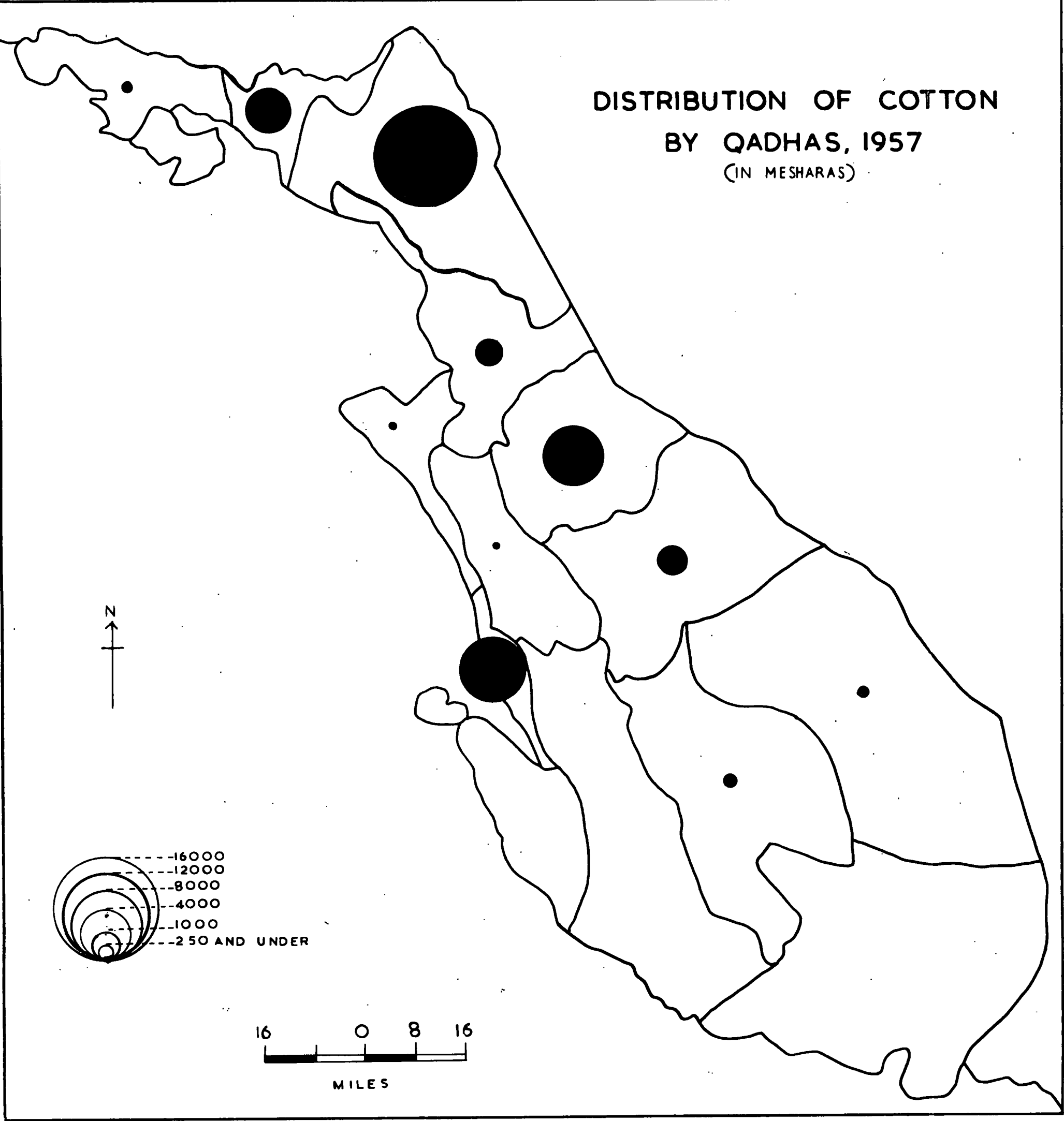

(IN MESHARAS)

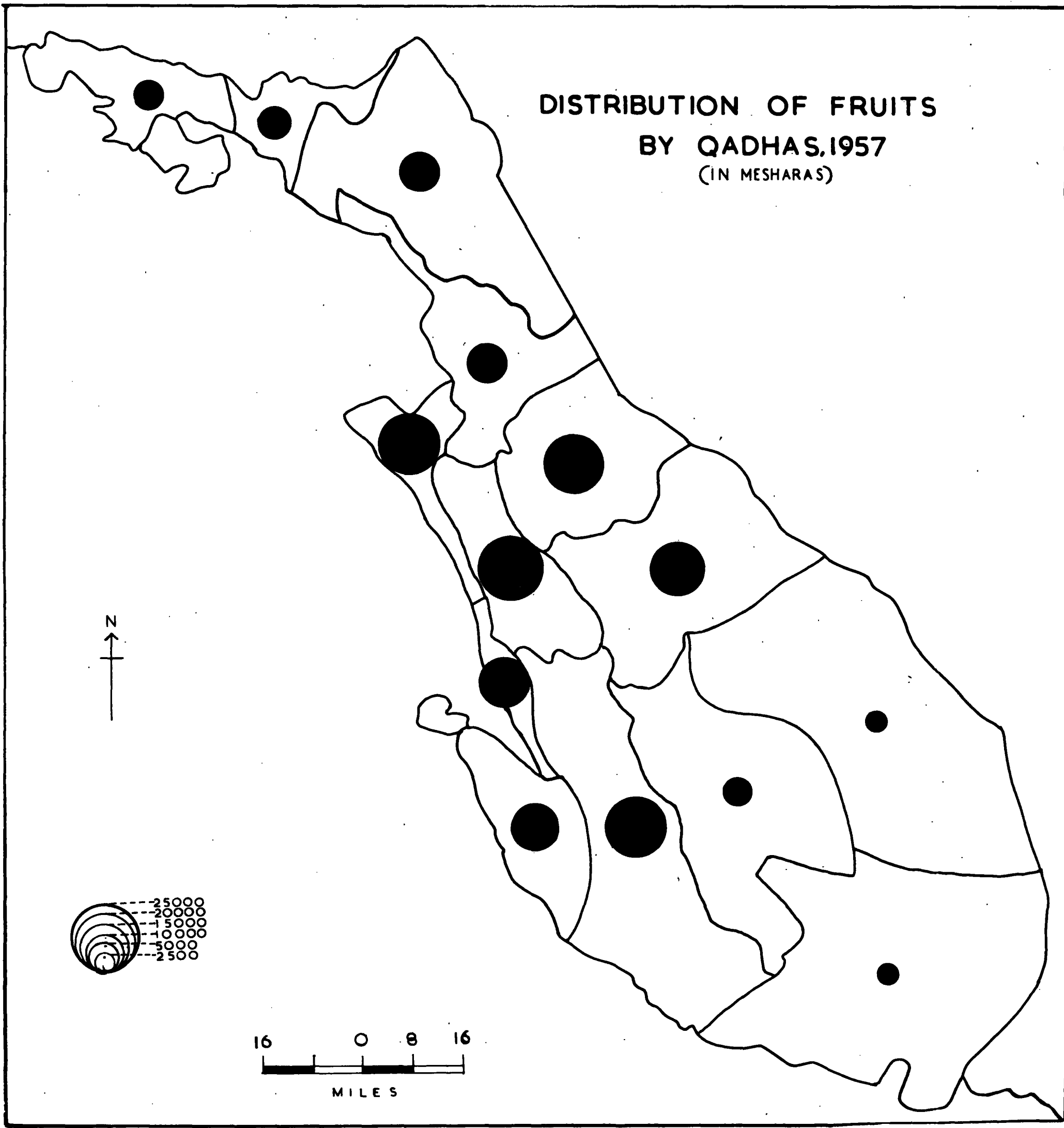

DISTRIBUTION OF FRUIT TREES AND PERCENTAGE OF EACH TYPE

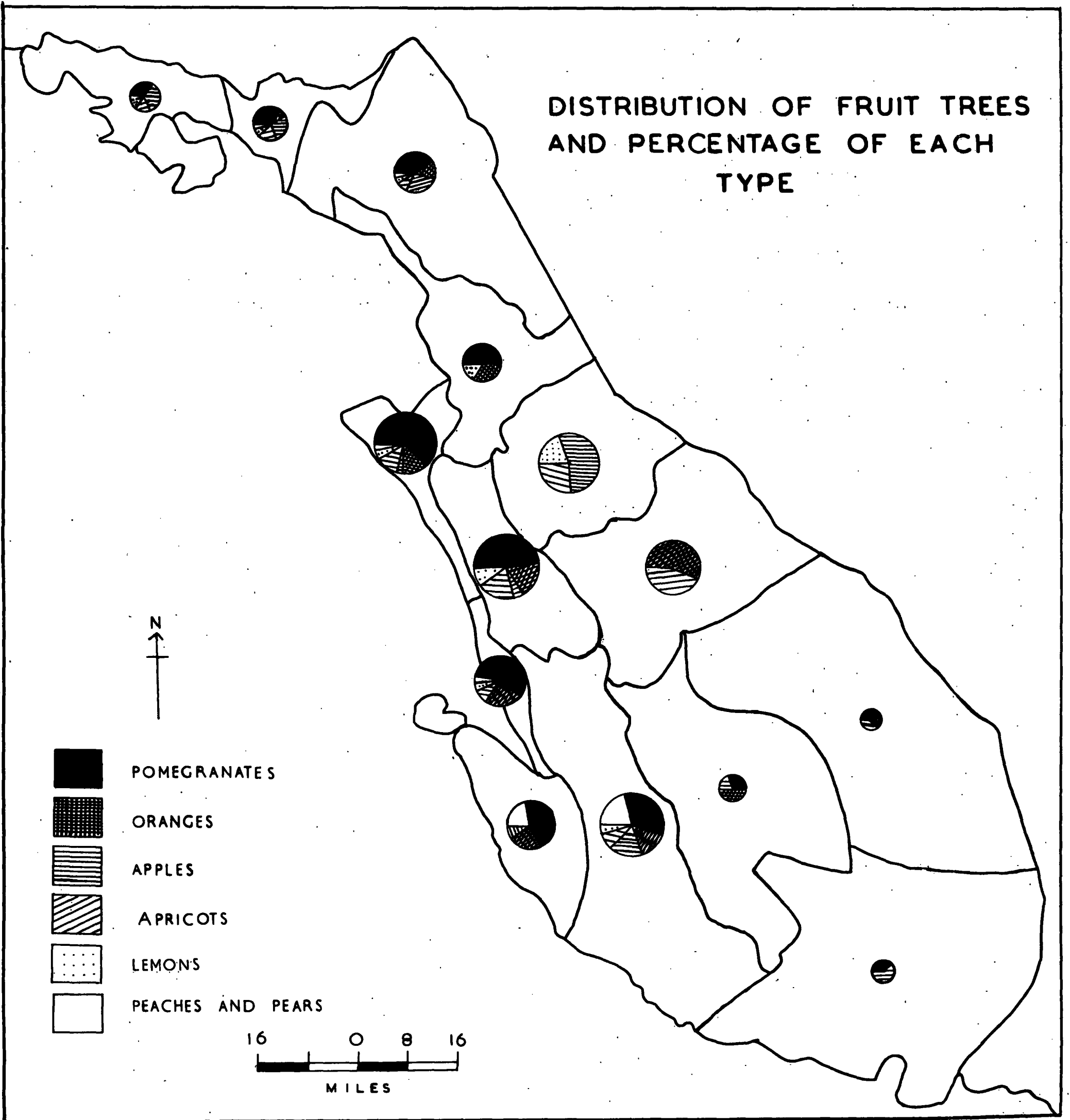

(IN MESHARAS)

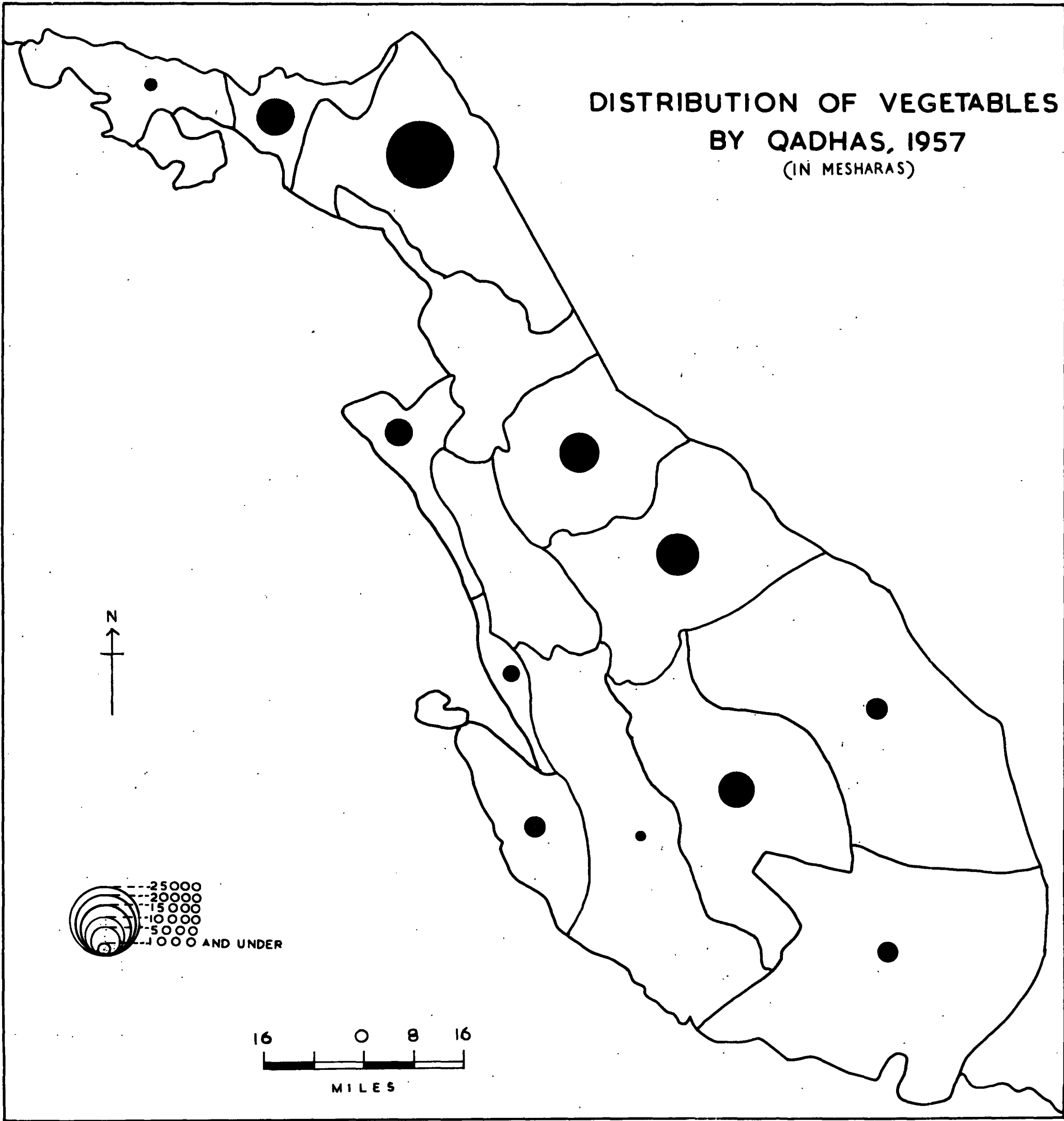

TOTAL POPULATION 1098428

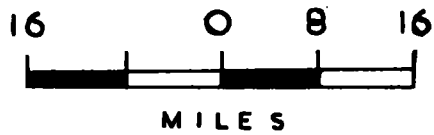

TOTAL POPULATION 216,385

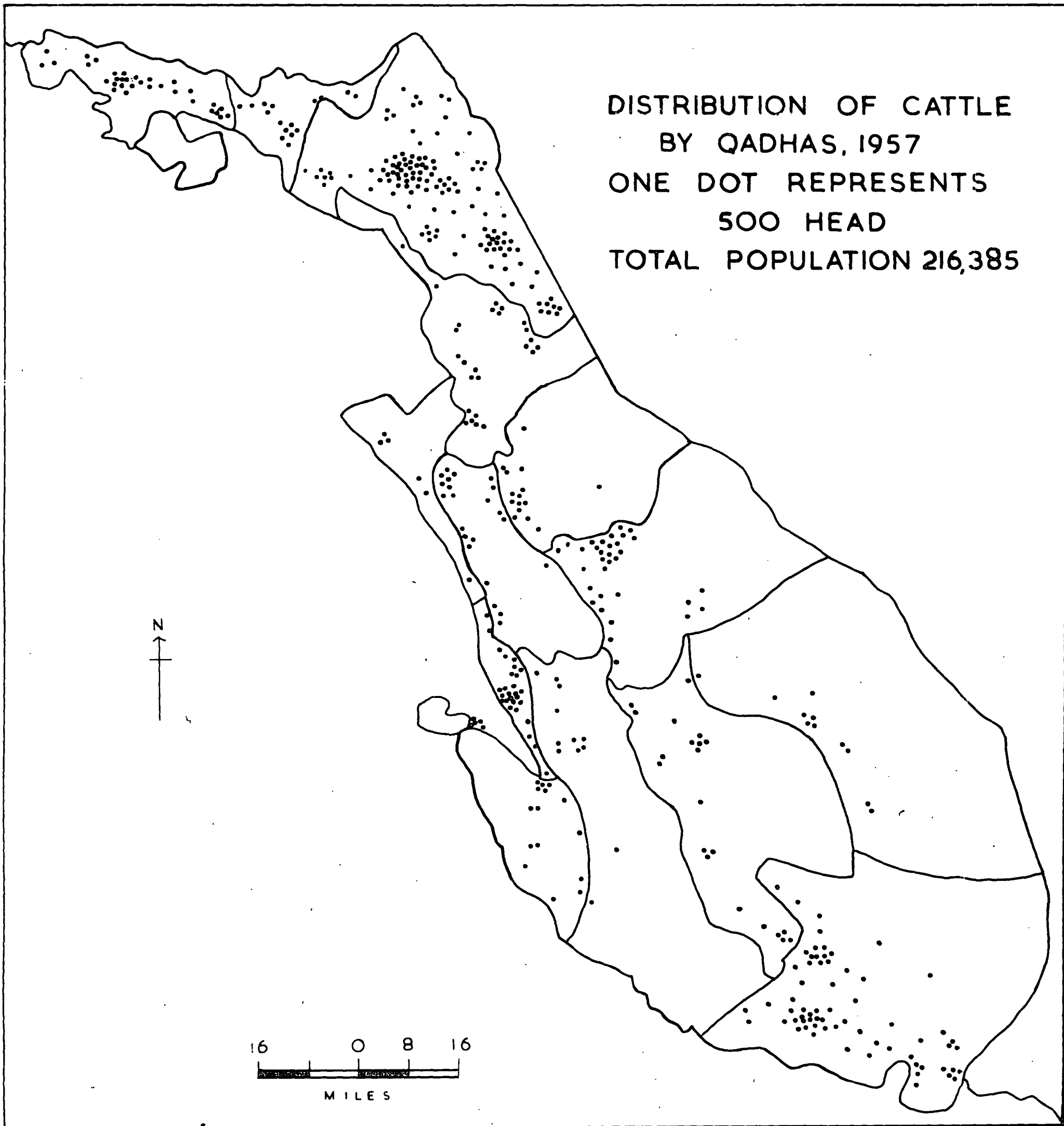

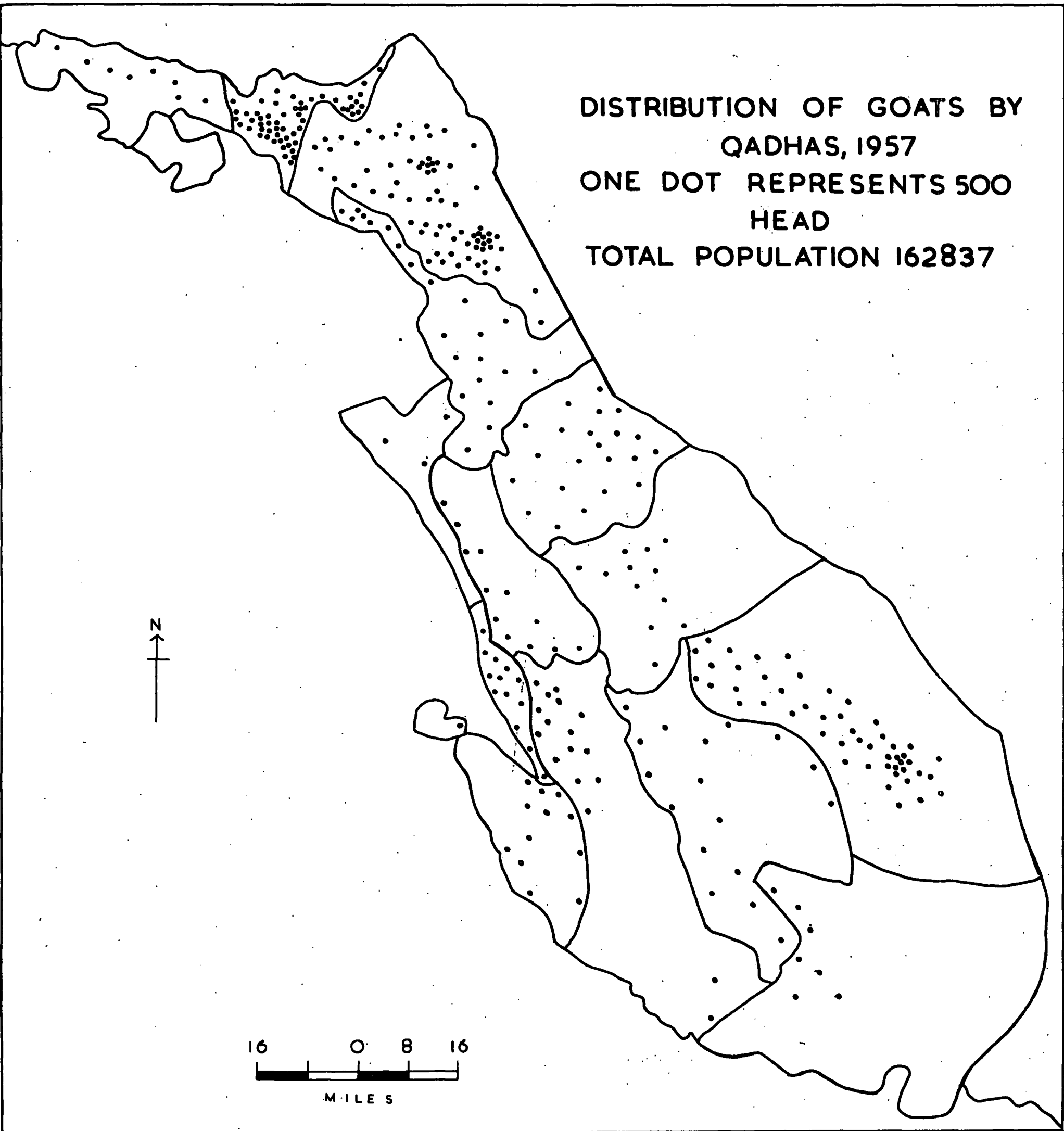

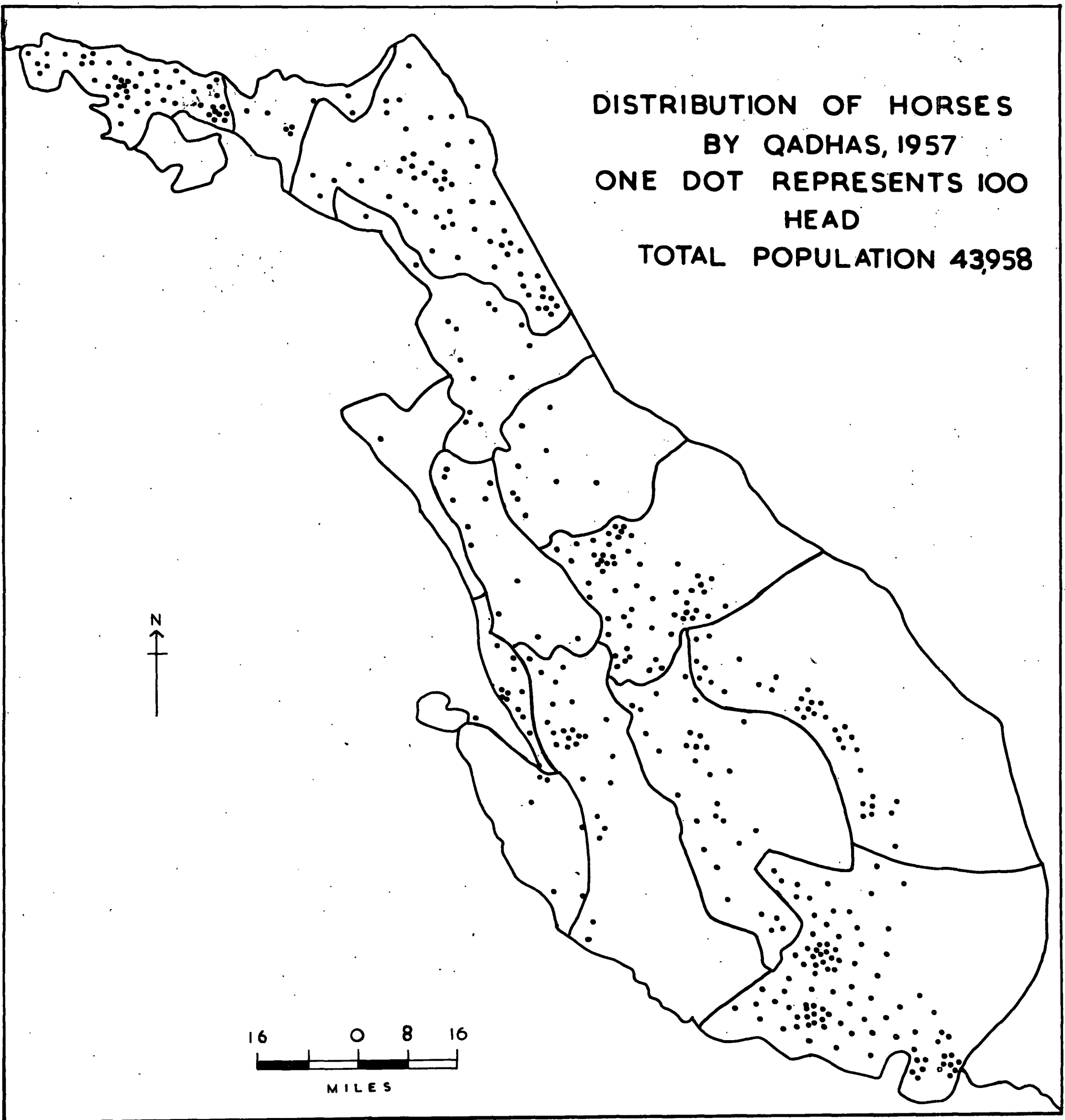

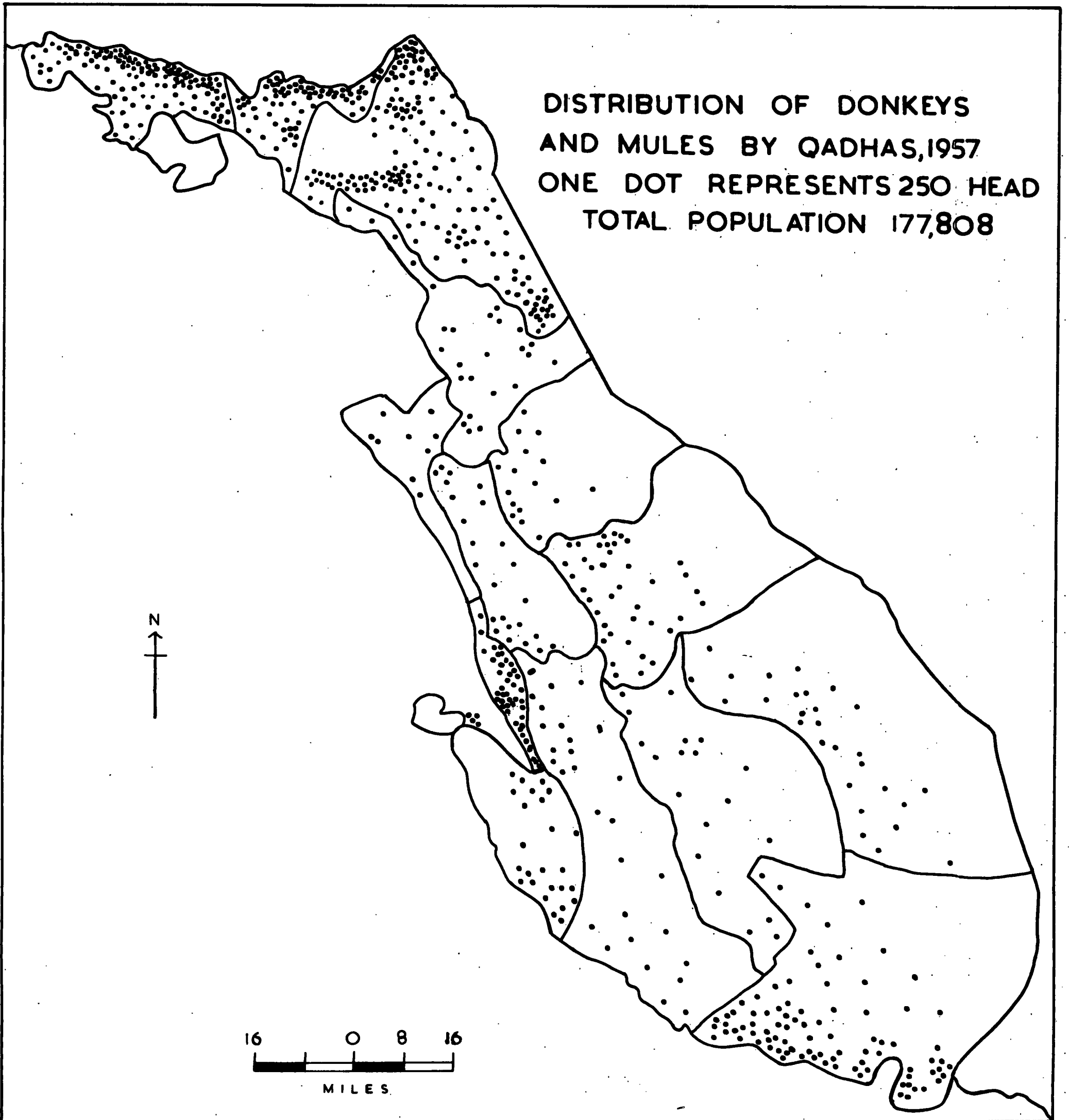
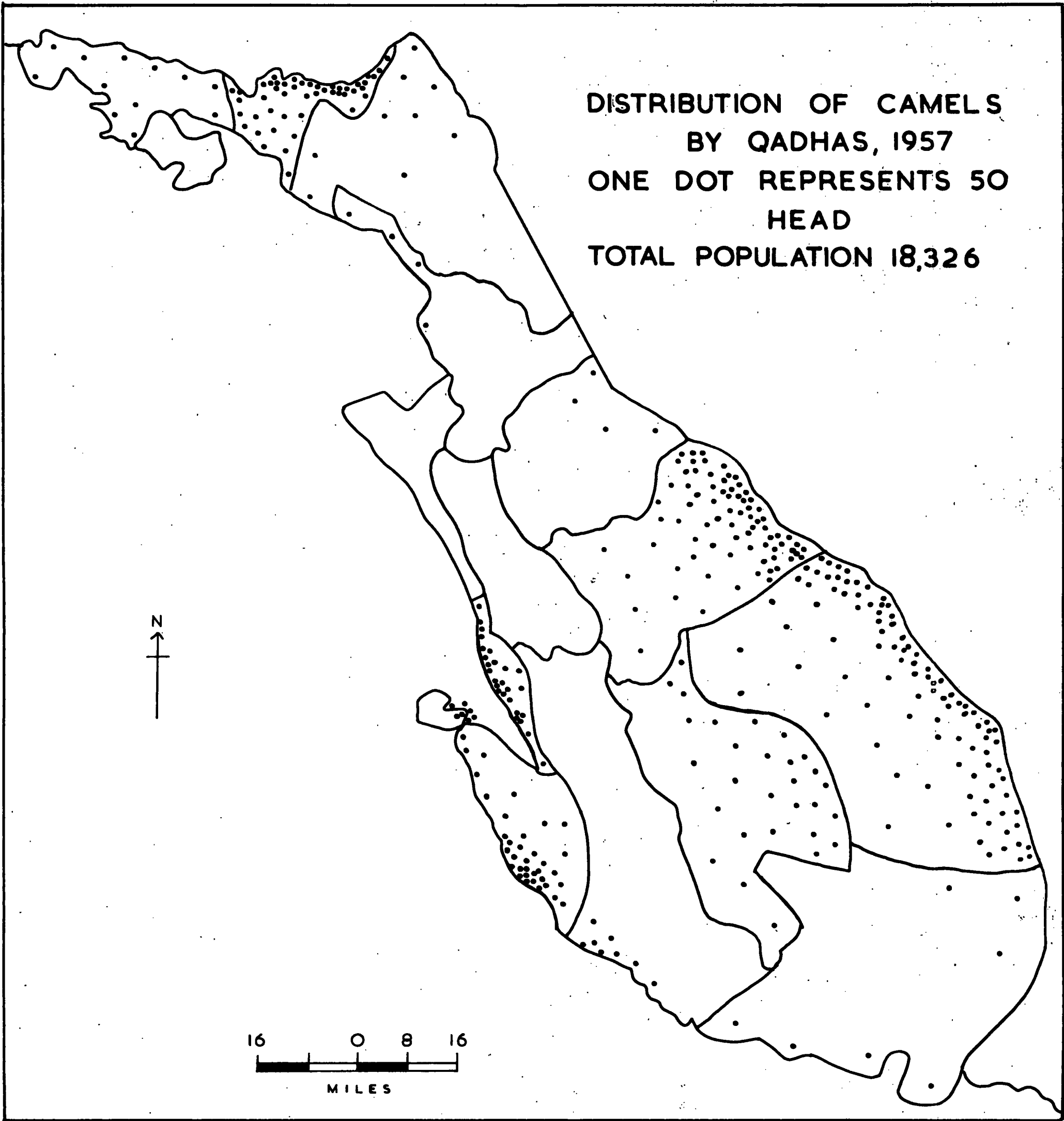

BY NUMBER OF DWELLINGS, 1957

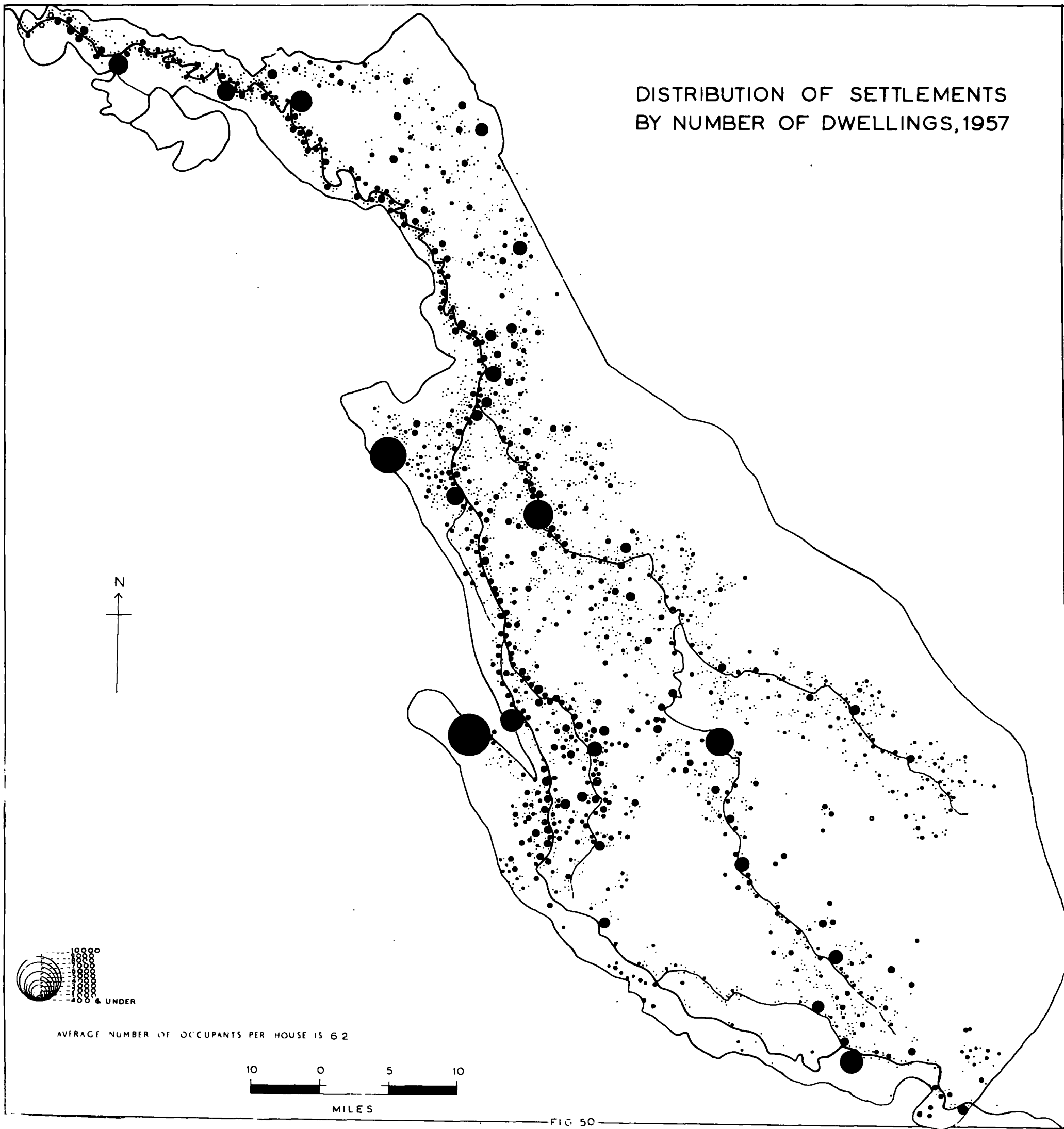

DISTRIBUTION OF SETTLED AND SEMI-SETTLED ARAB TRIBES, 1957

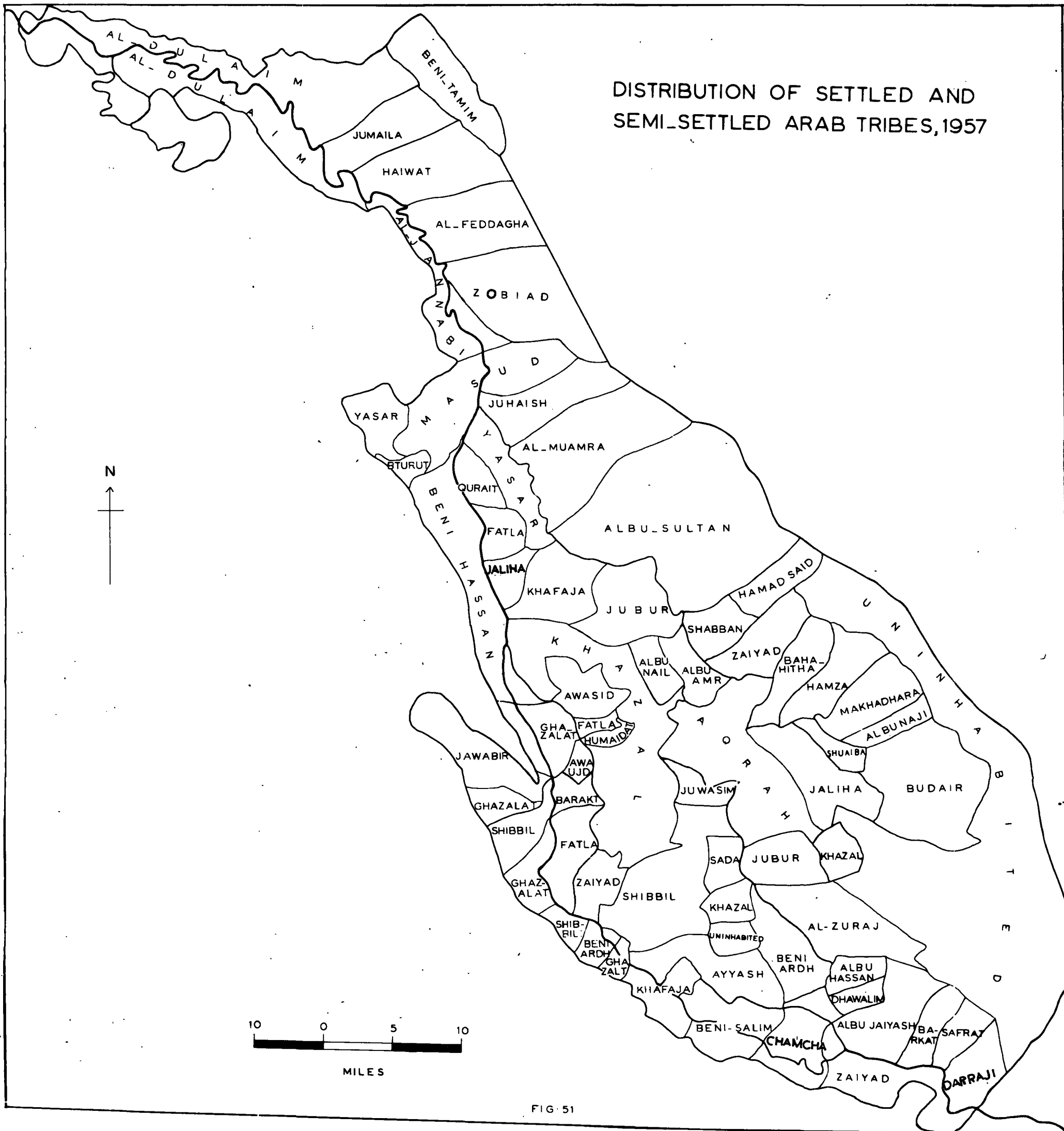

DISTRIBUTION OF THE TYPES OF LAND TENURE AND PERCENTAGE OF EACH TYPE, 1957

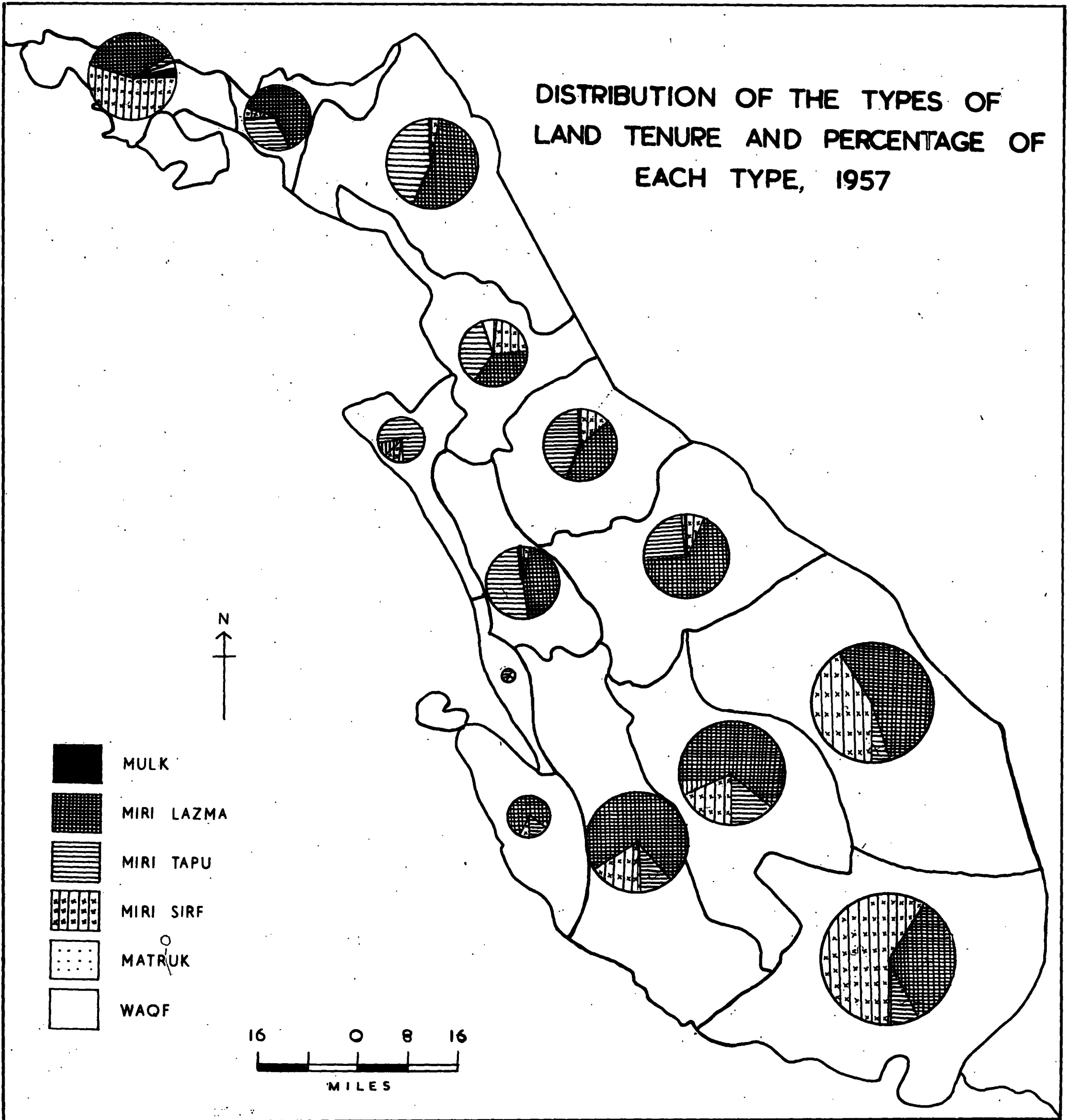

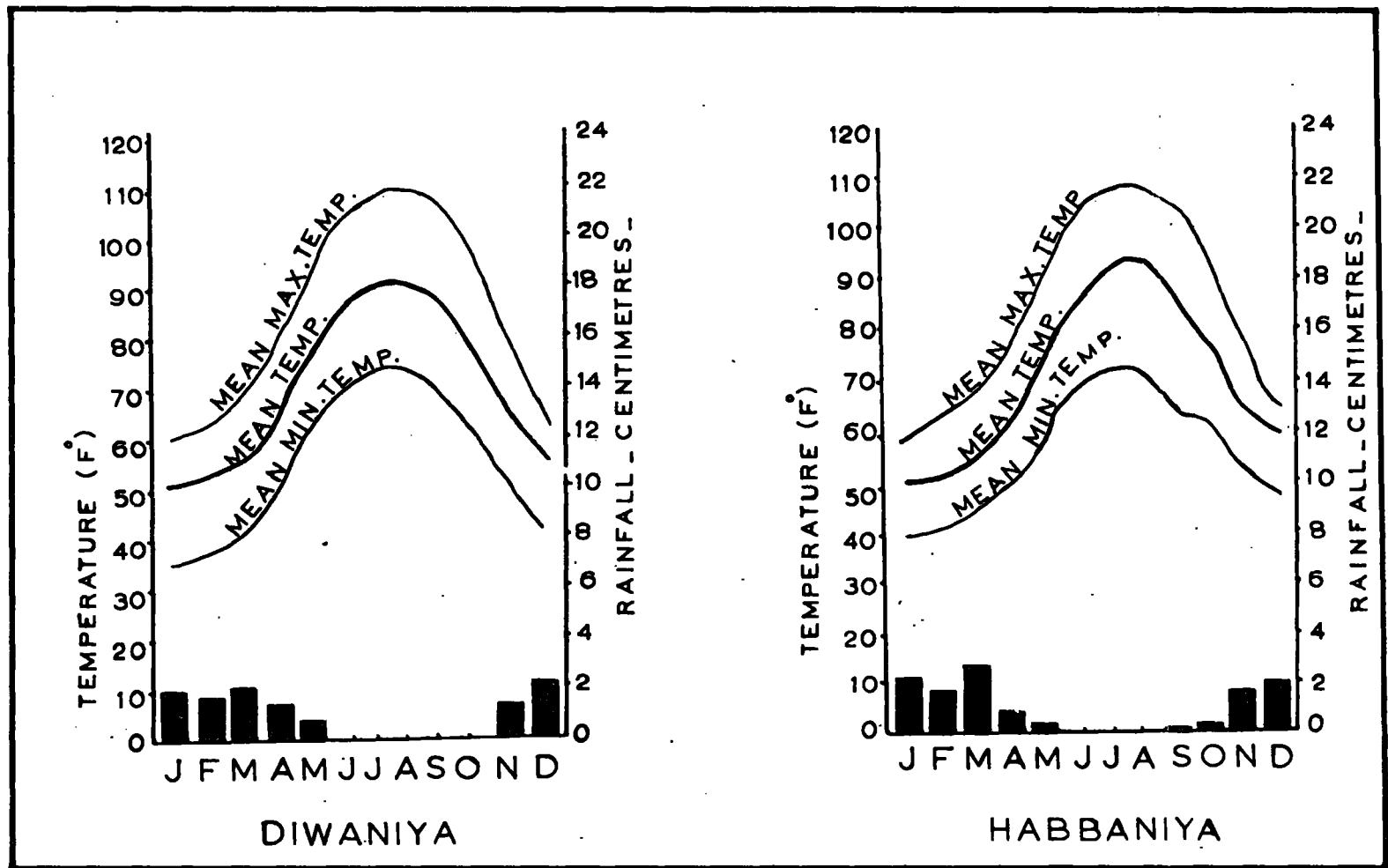

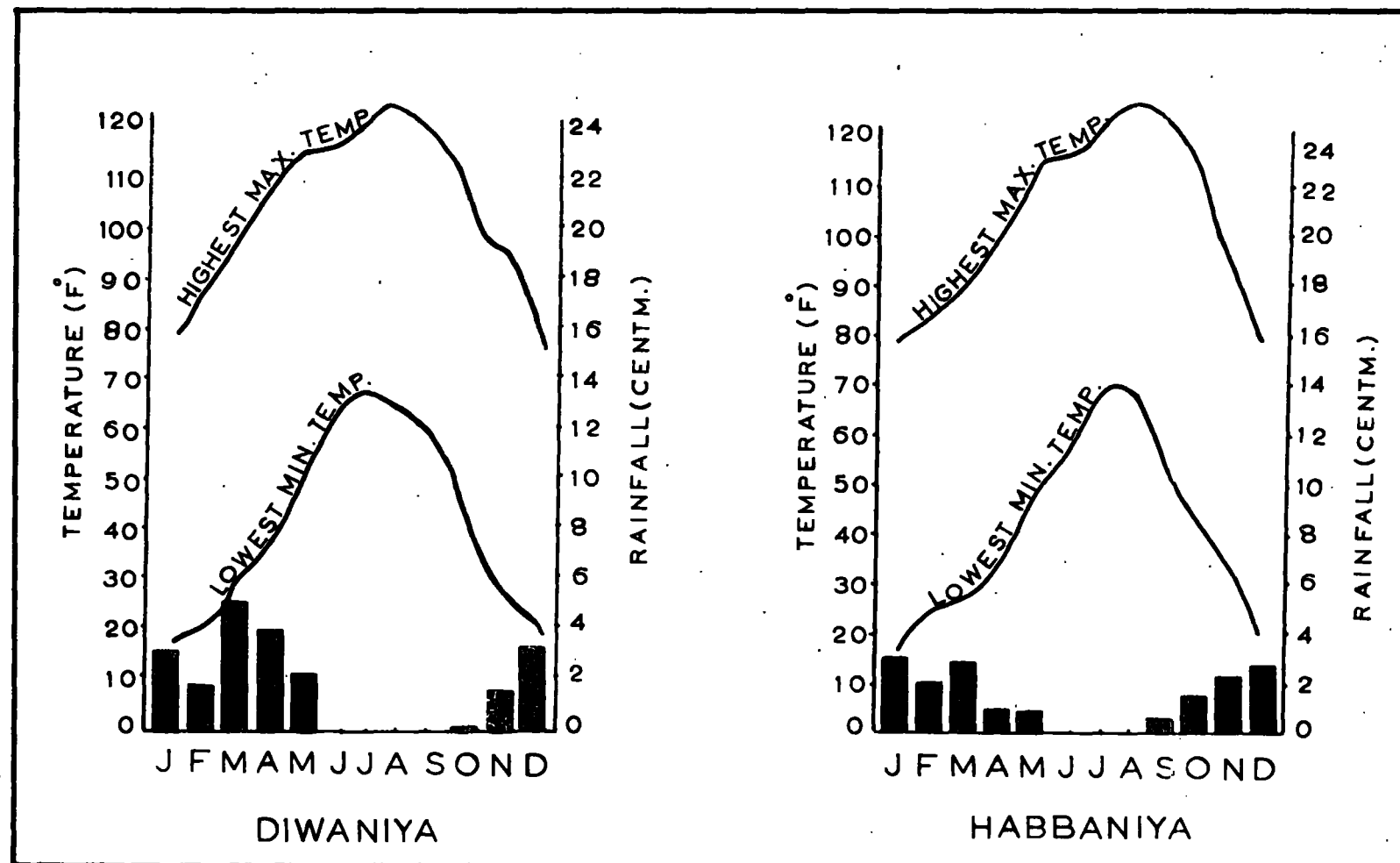
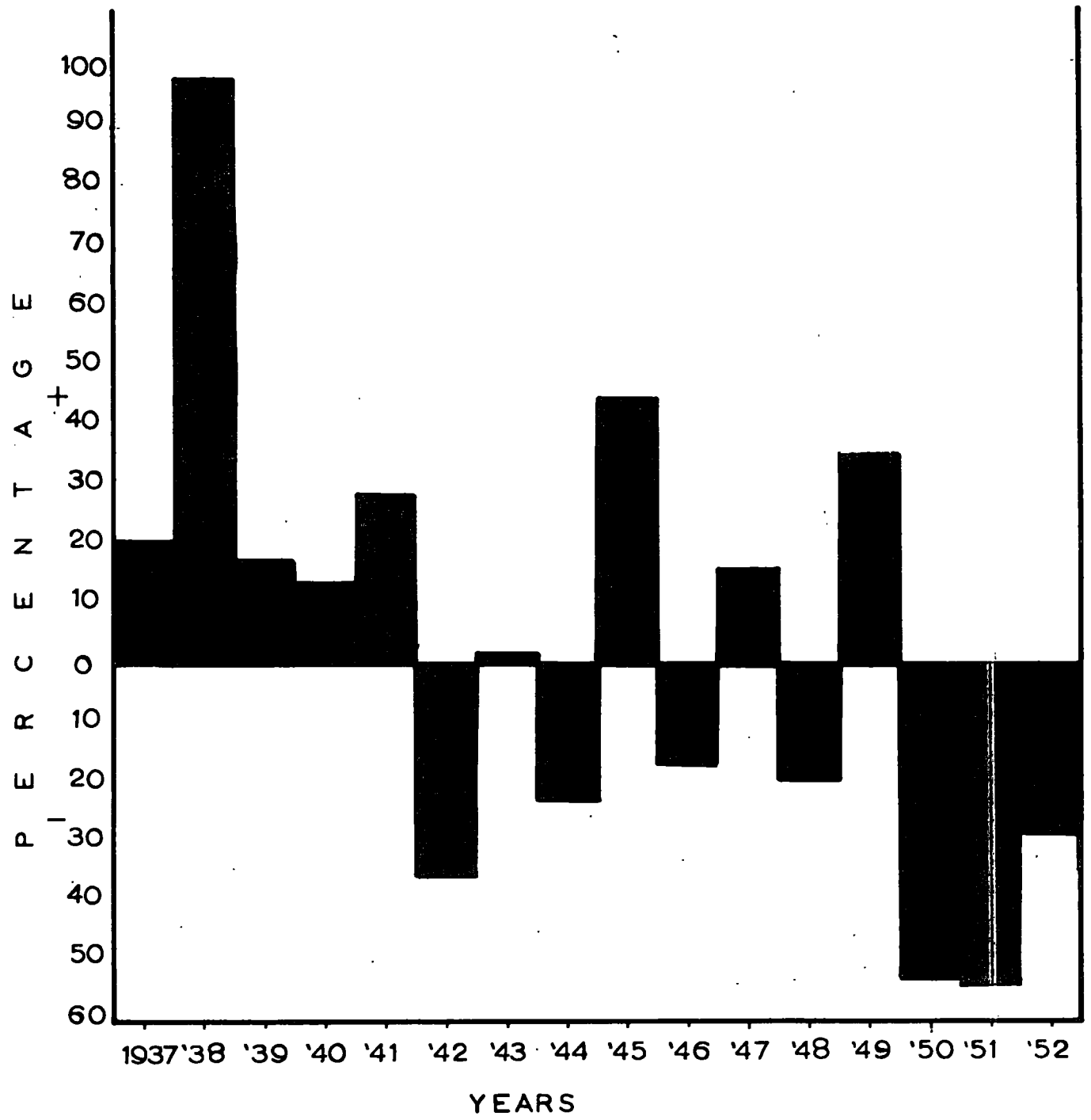

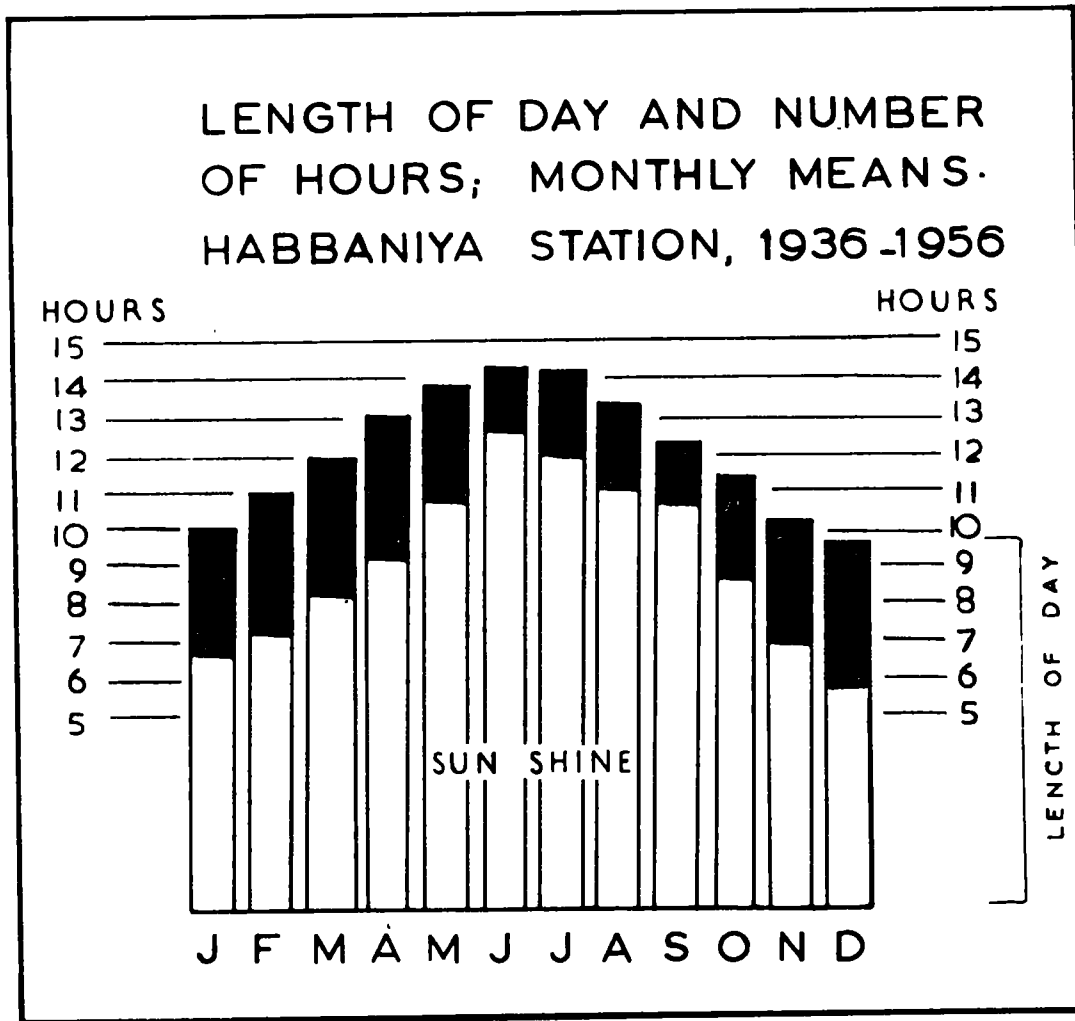
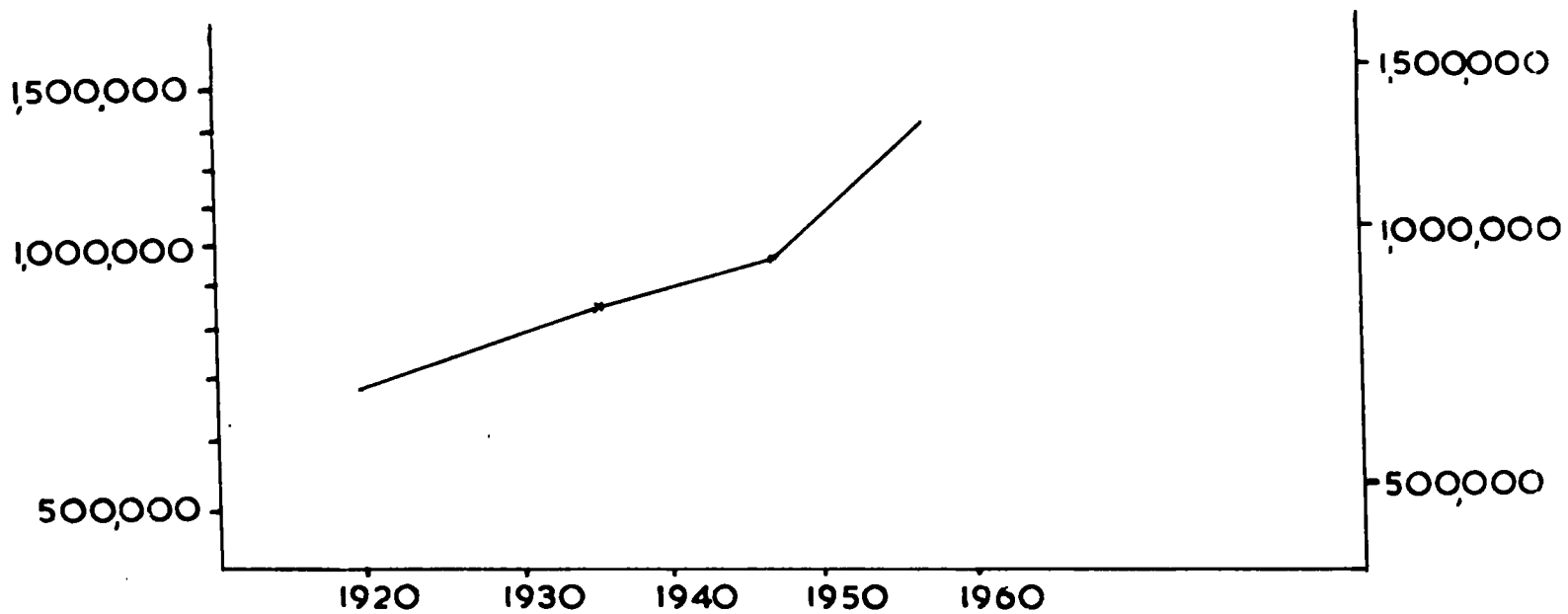

 AREA - IN MESHARAS -

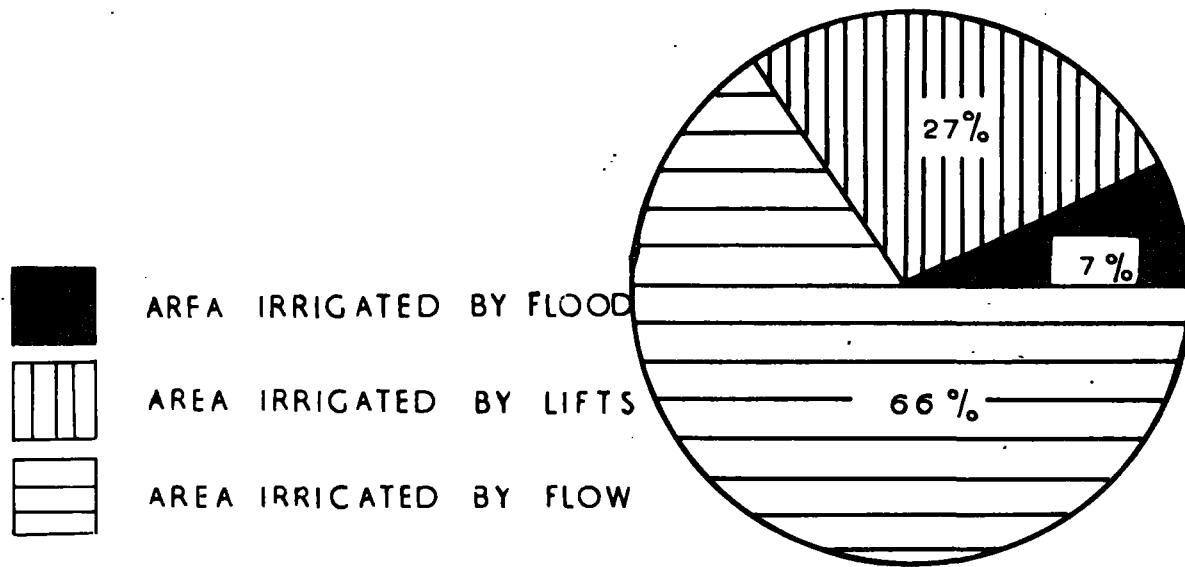

 EUPHRATES VALLEY, 1957

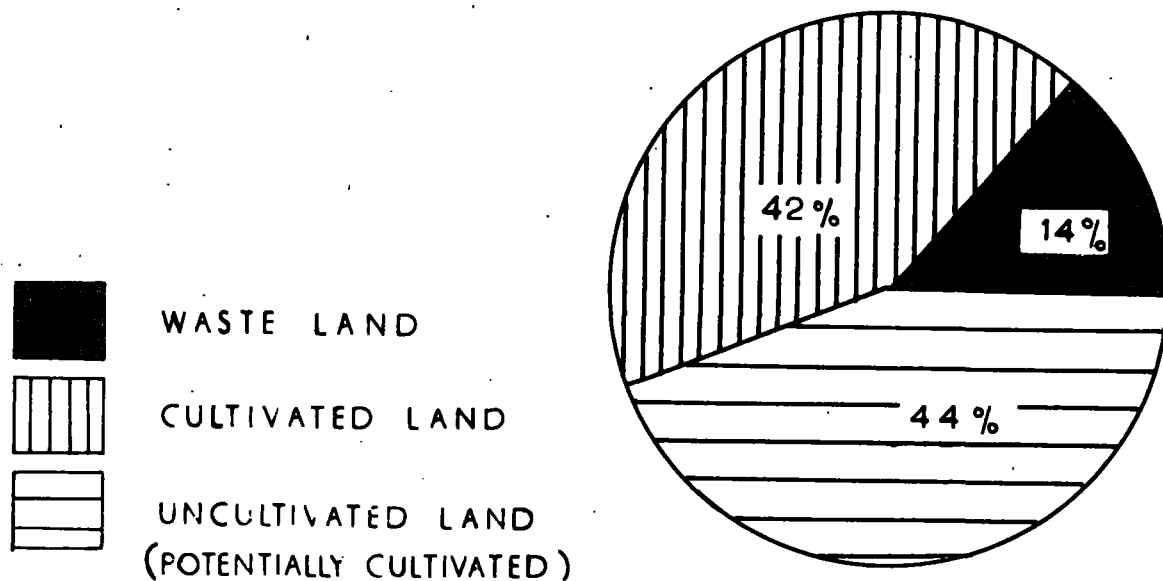

 AREA - IN MESHARAS - , 1957

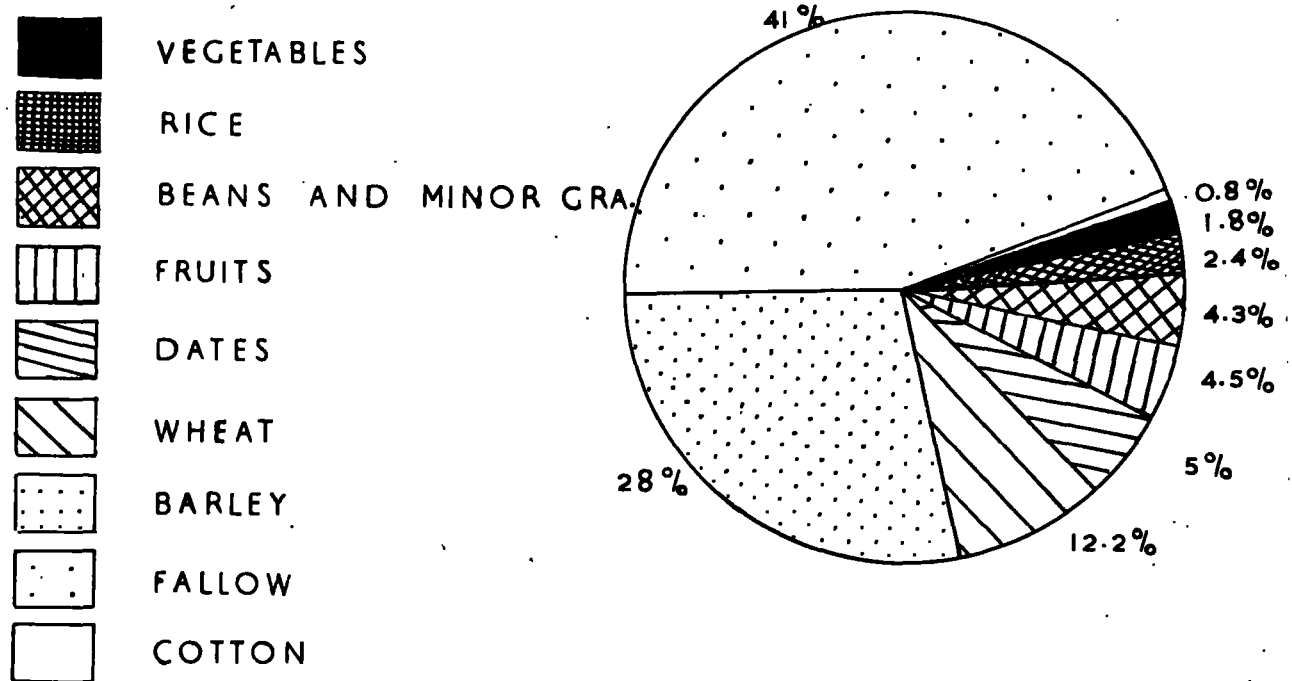

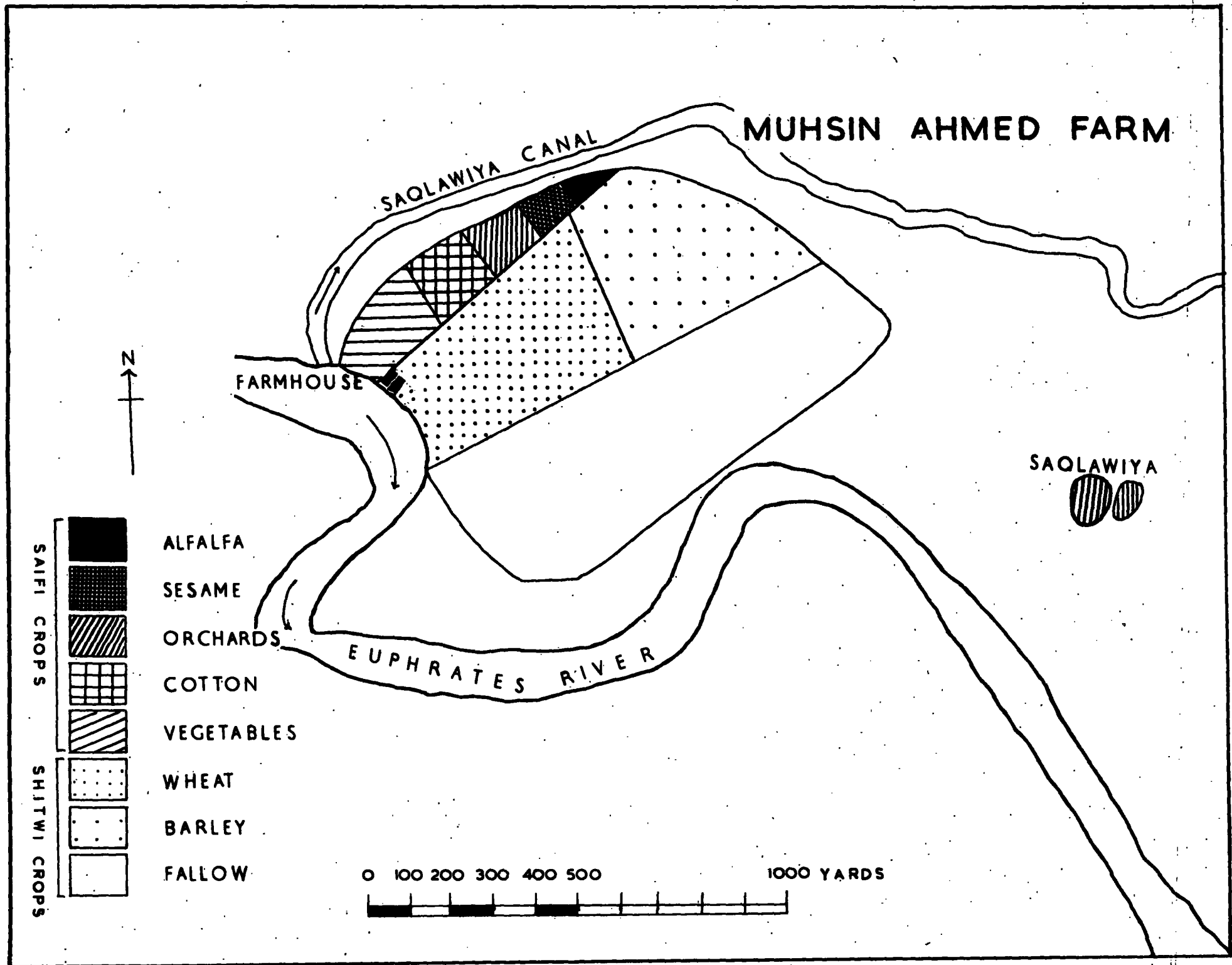
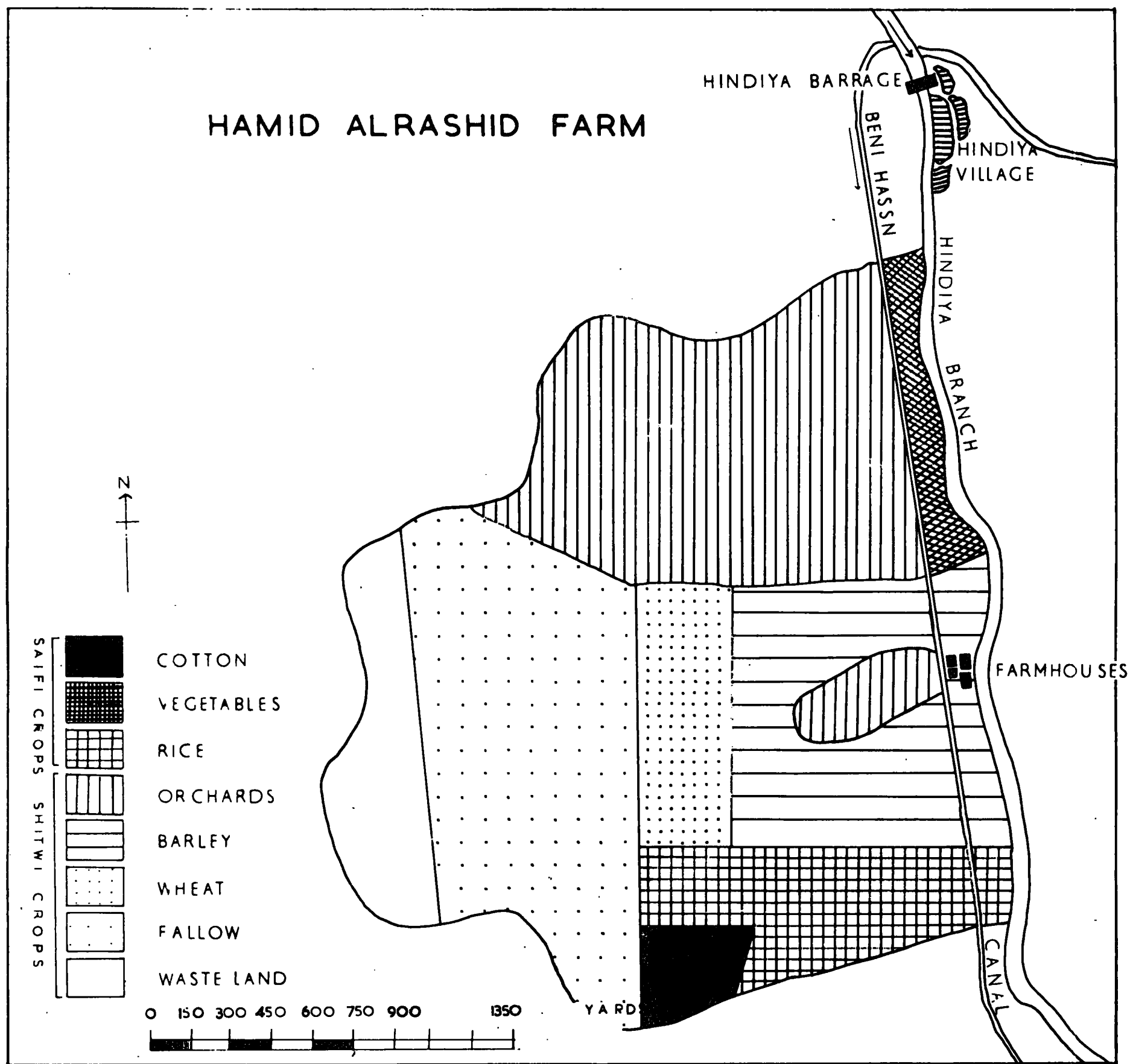

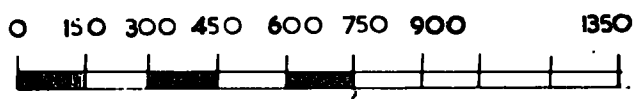

HAJ MAHDI AL HAMID FARM

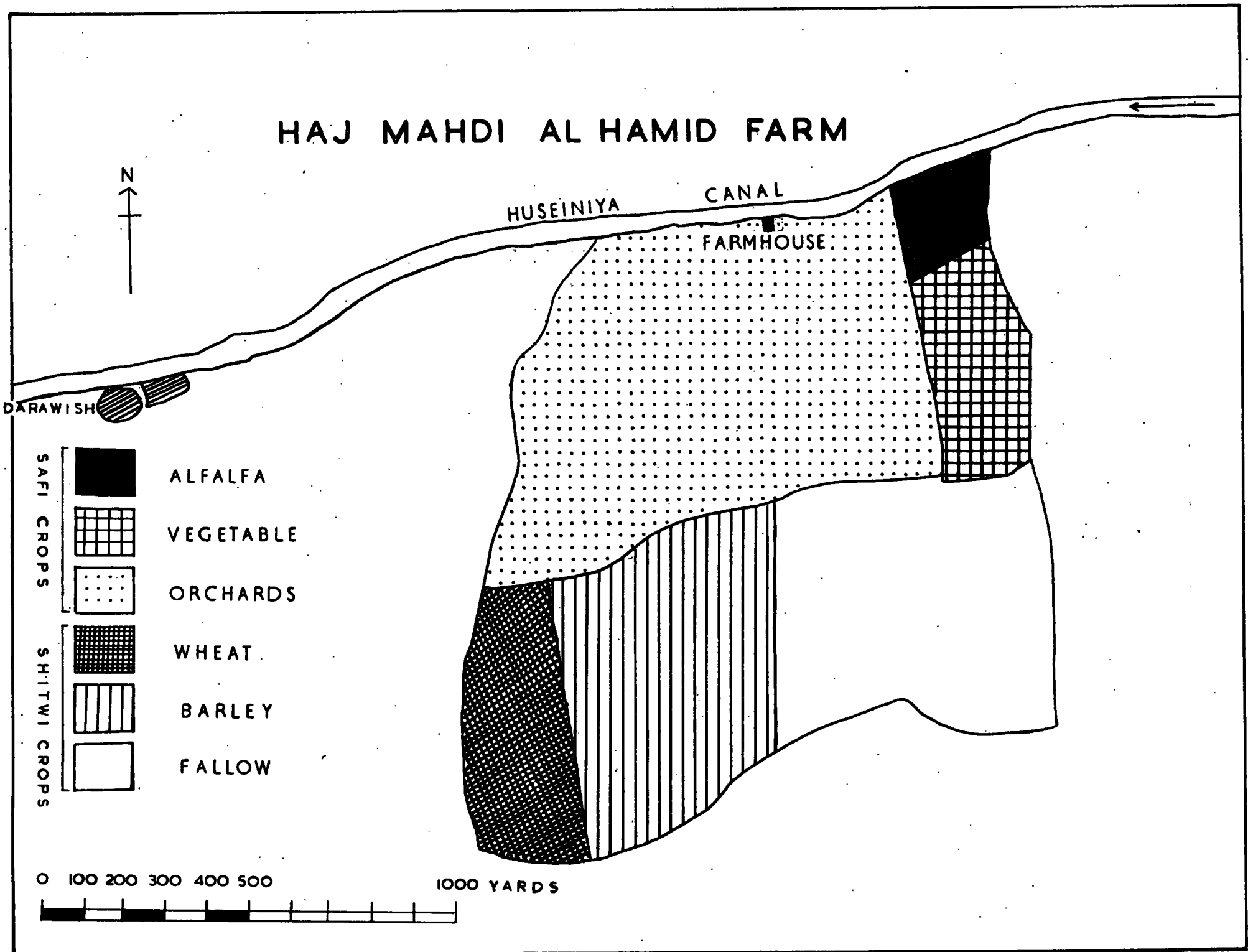

HAJ ATIYAH FARM

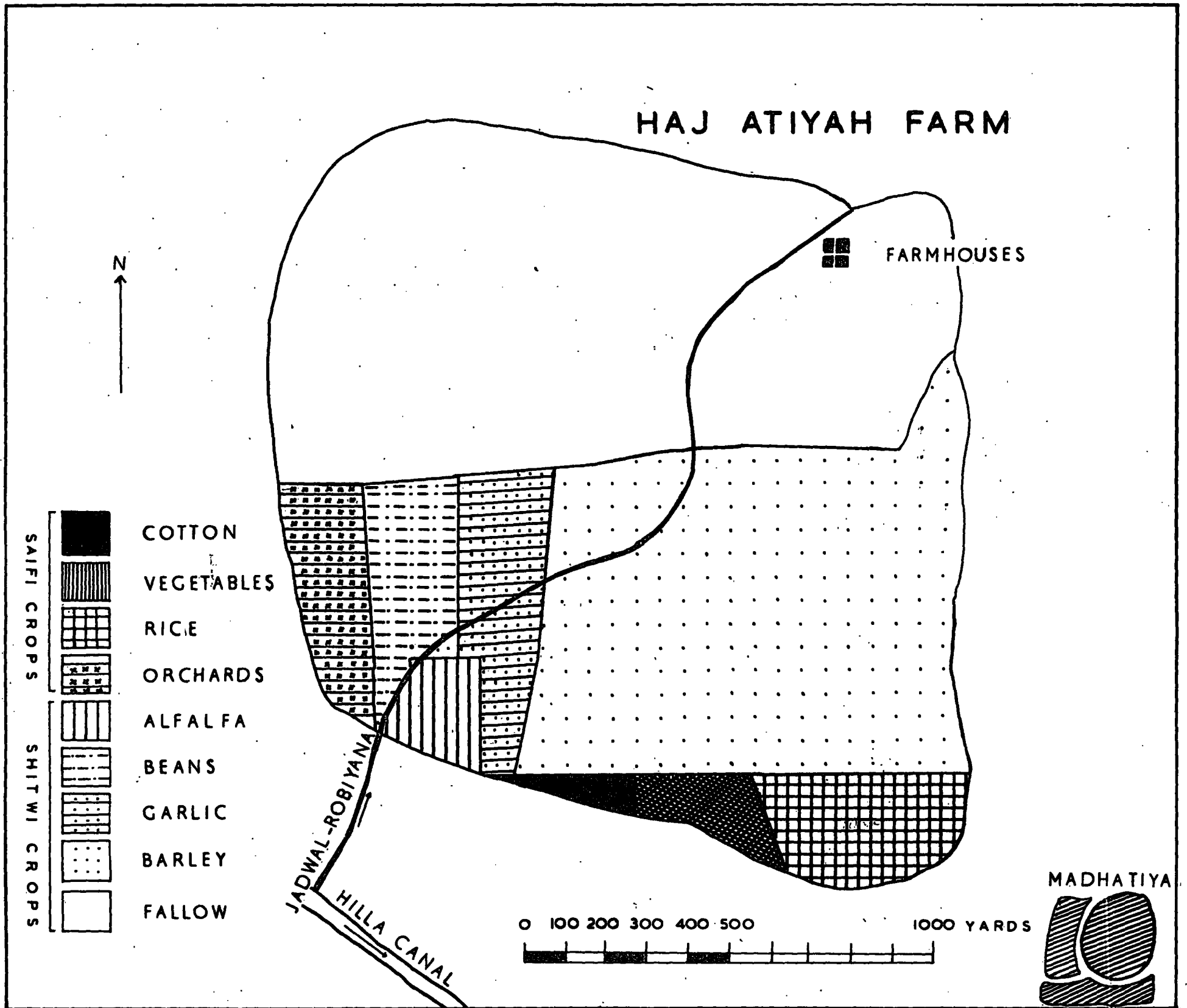

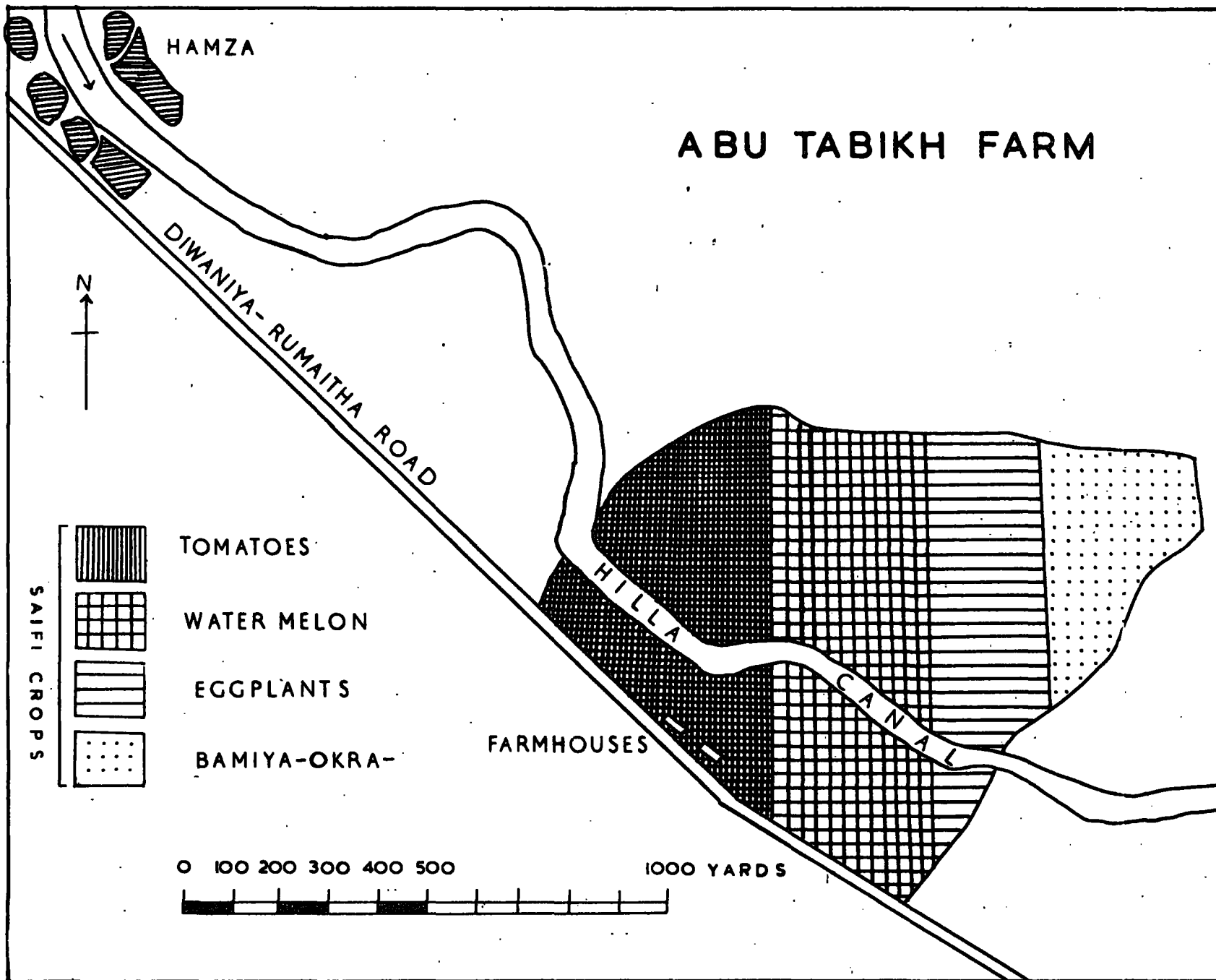

SHAMIYA NO. 20 FARM

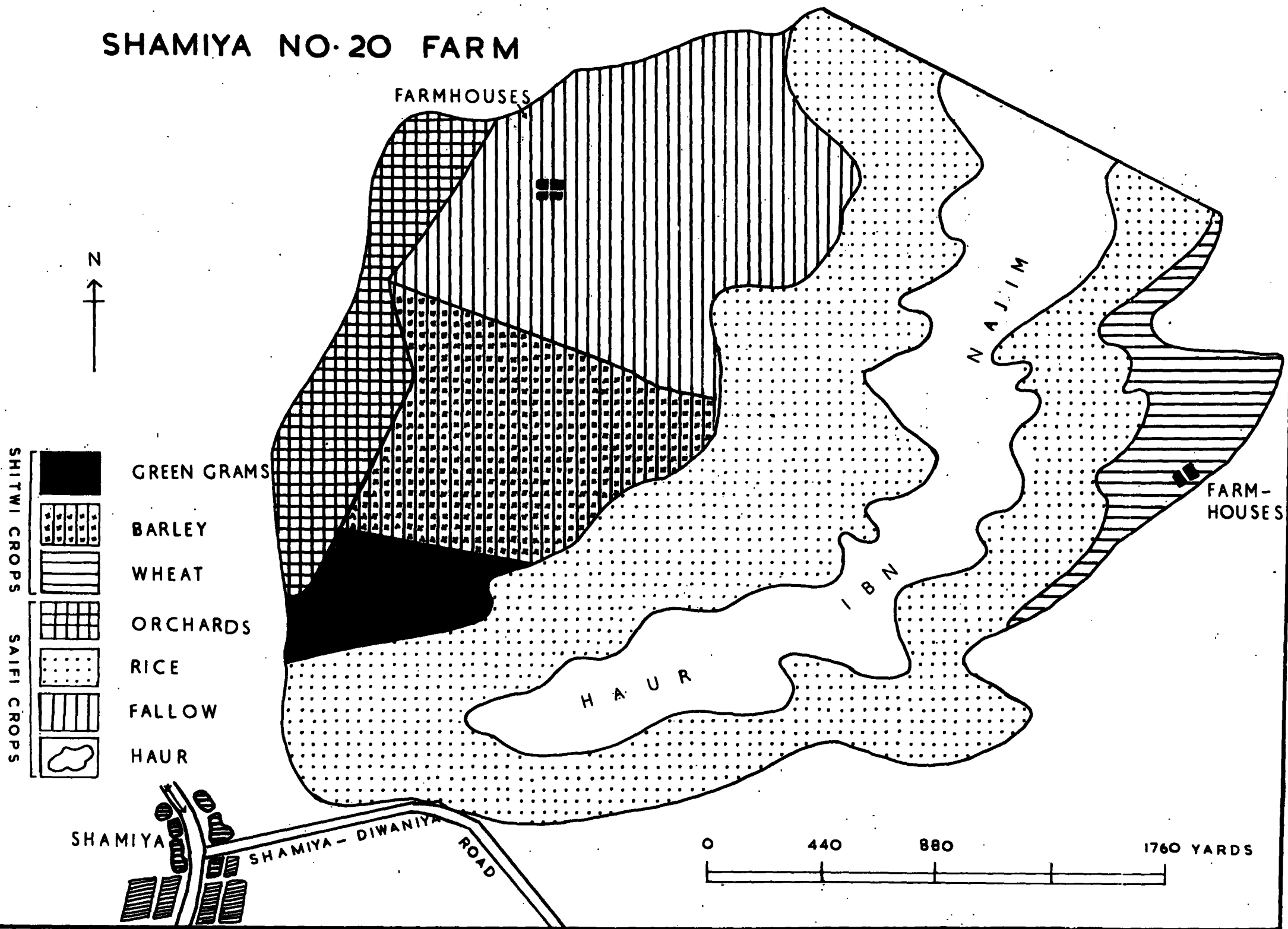
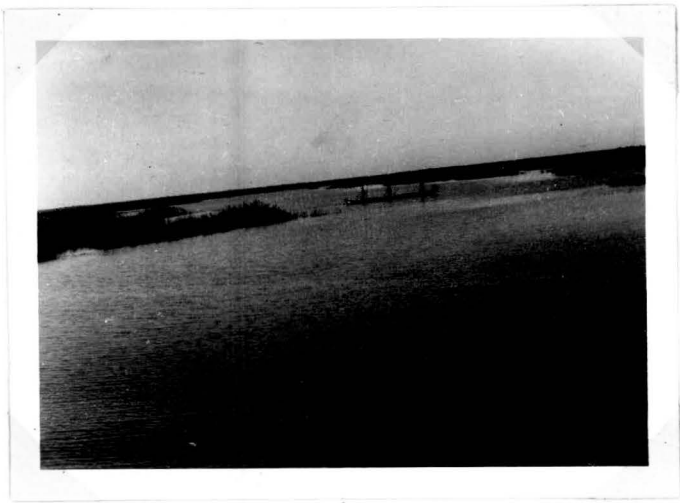
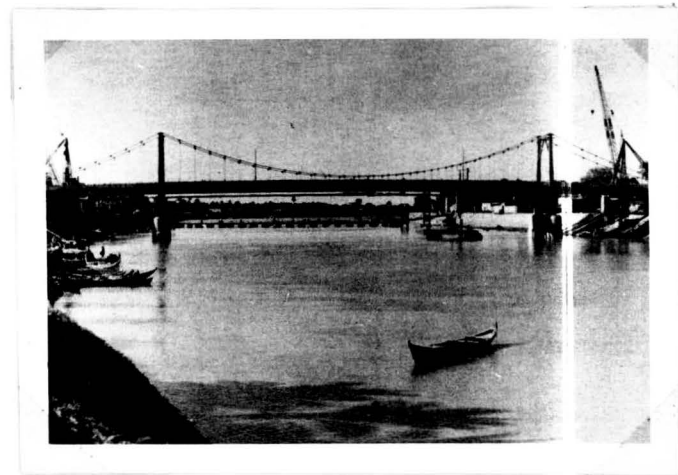
